A JOINT RESOLUTION

- 1 proposing a constitutional amendment authorizing the legislature
- 2 to provide for an exemption from ad valorem taxation of part of the
- 3 market value of the residence homestead of a partially disabled
- 4 veteran or the surviving spouse of a partially disabled veteran
- 5 based on the disability rating of the veteran and harmonizing
- 6 certain related provision of the constitution.
- 7 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 8 SECTION 1. Section 1-b(j), Article VIII, Texas
 - Constitution, is amended to read as follows:
- 10 (j) The legislature by general law may provide that the
- 11 surviving spouse of a disabled veteran who qualified for an
- 12 exemption in accordance with Subsection (i), [ext] (1), or (q) of
- 13 this section from ad valorem taxation of all or part of the market
- 14 value of the disabled veteran's residence homestead when the
- 15 disabled veteran died is entitled to an exemption from ad valorem
- 16 taxation of the same portion of the market value of the same
- 17 property to which the disabled veteran's exemption applied if:
- 18 (1) the surviving spouse has not remarried since the
- 19 death of the disabled veteran; and
- 20 (2) the property:
- 21 (A) was the residence homestead of the surviving
- 22 spouse when the disabled veteran died; and
- 23 (B) remains the residence homestead of the
- 24 surviving spouse.

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- 1 SECTION 2. Section 1-b(1), Article VIII, Texas
- 2 Constitution, as proposed by H.J.R. 62, 83rd Legislature, Regular
- 3 Session, 2013, is redesignated as Section 1-b(m), Article VIII,
- 4 Texas Constitution, to read as follows:
- 5 (m) $[\frac{(1)}{(1)}]$ The legislature by general law may provide that
- 6 the surviving spouse of a member of the armed services of the United
- 7 States who is killed in action is entitled to an exemption from ad
- 8 valorem taxation of all or part of the market value of the surviving
- 9 spouse's residence homestead if the surviving spouse has not
- 10 remarried since the death of the member of the armed services.
- 11 SECTION 3. Section 1-b(m), Article VIII, Texas
- 12 Constitution, is redesignated as Section 1-b(n), Article VIII,
- 13 Texas Constitution, and amended to read as follows:
- (n) $\left[\frac{m}{m}\right]$ The legislature by general law may provide that a
- 15 surviving spouse who qualifies for and receives an exemption in
- 16 accordance with Subsection (m) [(1)] of this section and who
- 17 subsequently qualifies a different property as the surviving
- 18 spouse's residence homestead is entitled to an exemption from ad
- 19 valorem taxation of the subsequently qualified homestead in an
- 20 amount equal to the dollar amount of the exemption from ad valorem
- 21 taxation of the first homestead for which the exemption was
- 22 received in accordance with Subsection (m) $[\frac{1}{1}]$ of this section in
- 23 the last year in which the surviving spouse received the exemption
- 24 in accordance with that subsection for that homestead if the
- 25 surviving spouse has not remarried since the death of the member of
- 26 the armed services.
- 27 SECTION 4. Section 1-b, Article VIII, Texas Constitution,

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1 is amended by adding Subsection (q) to read as follows:

2 The legislature by general law may provide that a partially disabled veteran is entitled to an exemption from ad 3 valorem taxation of a percentage of the market value of the 4 disabled veteran's residence homestead that is equal to the 5 percentage of disability of the disabled veteran. The legislature 6 by general law may provide additional eligibility requirements for 7 the exemption. For purposes of this subsection, "partially disabled 8 veteran" means a disabled veteran as described by Section 2(b) of 9 this article who is certified as having a disability rating of at 10 least 80 percent but less than 100 percent. A limitation or 11 restriction on a disabled veteran's entitlement to an exemption 12 under Section 2(b) of this article, or on the amount of an 13 14 exemption under Section 2(b), does not apply to an exemption under 15 this subsection. SECTION 5. This proposed constitutional amendment shall be 16

17 submitted to the voters at an election to be held November 5, 2019. The ballot shall be printed to permit voting for or against the 18 19 proposition: "The constitutional amendment authorizing legislature to provide for an exemption from ad valorem taxation of 20 part of the market value of the residence homestead of a partially 21 disabled veteran or the surviving spouse of a partially disabled 22 veteran based on the disability rating of the veteran 23 24 harmonizing certain related provisions of the constitution."
