## A JOINT RESOLUTION

- 1 proposing a constitutional amendment establishing an increased
- 2 minimum wage.
- 3 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Article XVI, Texas Constitution, is amended by
- 5 adding Section 29 to read as follows:
- 6 Sec. 29. (a) An employer in this state shall pay to an
- 7 employee for services performed by the employee not less than the
- 8 greater of:
- 9 (1) \$15 an hour; or
- 10 (2) the federal minimum wage under Section 6, Fair
- 11 Labor Standards Act of 1938 (29 U.S.C. Section 206).
- 12 (b) Subsection (a) of this section does not apply to:
- (1) wages paid to an individual to whom Section
- 14 62.057, Labor Code, applies, as that section existed on January 1,
- 15 2020; or
- 16 (2) an employer to which an exemption under Subchapter
- 17 D, Chapter 62, Labor Code, applies, as that subchapter existed on
- 18 <u>January 1, 2020.</u>
- (c) The legislature by general law may repeal or otherwise
- 20 limit but may not expand the applicability of Section 62.057, Labor
- 21 Code, or an exemption under Subchapter D, Chapter 62, Labor Code,
- 22 that is in effect on January 1, 2020.
- 23 (d) This subsection applies to wages paid by an employer for
- 24 the 2020 and 2021 calendar years. Subsection (a) of this section

- 1 does not apply in a year to which this subsection applies. Except
- 2 as provided by Section 62.057, Labor Code:
- 3 (1) for the 2020 calendar year, an employer shall pay
- 4 to each employee not less than the greater of:
- 5 (A) \$10 an hour; or
- 6 (B) the federal minimum wage under Section 6,
- 7 Fair Labor Standards Act of 1938 (29 U.S.C. Section 206); and
- 8 (2) for the 2021 calendar year, an employer shall pay
- 9 to each employee not less than the greater of:
- 10 <u>(A)</u> \$12.50 an hour; or
- 11 (B) the federal minimum wage under Section 6,
- 12 Fair Labor Standards Act of 1938 (29 U.S.C. Section 206).
- 13 (e) This section takes effect January 1, 2020.
- 14 (f) Subsections (d) and (e) of this section and this
- 15 subsection expire January 1, 2022.
- 16 SECTION 2. This proposed constitutional amendment shall be
- 17 submitted to the voters at an election to be held November 5, 2019.
- 18 The ballot shall be printed to permit voting for or against the
- 19 proposition: "The constitutional amendment establishing a minimum
- 20 wage of the greater of \$15 an hour or the federal minimum wage."
