## A JOINT RESOLUTION

- 1 proposing a constitutional amendment providing for the
- 2 reapportionment of congressional districts and the creation,
- 3 function, and duties of the Texas Congressional Redistricting
- 4 Commission.
- 5 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Article III, Texas Constitution, is amended by
- 7 adding Sections 28a and 28b to read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 28a. (a) In this section:
- 9 (1) "Commission" means the Texas Congressional
- 10 Redistricting Commission established under Section 28b of this
- 11 article.
- 12 (2) "Redistricting plan" means a redistricting plan
- 13 for the election of the members of the United States House of
- 14 Representatives elected from this state.
- 15 (3) "Redistricting year" means a year ending in the
- 16 numeral one.
- 17 (b) Except as otherwise provided by this section, the
- 18 <u>legislature exercises the authority of this state to adopt a</u>
- 19 redistricting plan for the election of the members of the United
- 20 States House of Representatives elected from this state.
- 21 (c) The legislature shall pass a bill that includes a
- 22 redistricting plan not later than September 30 of each
- 23 redistricting year. The legislature must pass the bill by an
- 24 affirmative vote of at least three-fifths of the members of each

- 1 house of the legislature, including at least:
- 2 (1) one-half of the members of each house of the
- 3 legislature who represent the largest political party in that
- 4 house; and
- 5 (2) one-half of the members of each house of the
- 6 legislature who represent the second largest political party in
- 7 <u>that house.</u>
- 8 (d) The commission shall adopt a redistricting plan if the
- 9 legislature fails to pass a redistricting plan in a redistricting
- 10 year as provided by Subsection (c) of this section. The commission
- 11 must adopt the plan not later than October 31 of that redistricting
- 12 year by the affirmative vote of at least four members of the
- 13 <u>commission</u>, including at least:
- 14 (1) two members of the commission who represent the
- 15 largest political party in the legislature; and
- 16 (2) two members of the commission who represent the
- 17 second largest political party in the legislature.
- (e) A redistricting plan adopted by the commission under
- 19 Subsection (d) of this section must be filed with the secretary of
- 20 state.
- 21 <u>(f) The legislature shall pass a bill that includes a</u>
- 22 redistricting plan if the commission fails to adopt a redistricting
- 23 plan in a redistricting year as provided by Subsection (d) of this
- 24 section. The legislature must pass the plan not later than November
- 25 <u>30 of that redistricting year by the vote required by Subsection (c)</u>
- 26 of this section.
- 27 (g) A redistricting plan passed by the legislature or

- 1 adopted by the commission under this section takes effect December
- 2 1 of the redistricting year in which the plan is passed or adopted
- 3 and remains in effect until December 1 of the next redistricting
- 4 year.
- 5 (h) The legislature may not pass, and the commission may not
- 6 adopt, a redistricting plan unless a joint committee of the
- 7 <u>legislature or the commission</u>, as applicable, has held at least two
- 8 public hearings on the plan at which members of the public are given
- 9 an opportunity to testify.
- (i) A redistricting plan passed by the legislature or
- 11 adopted by the commission must comply with the requirements of this
- 12 constitution and the United States Constitution.
- 13 (j) The Supreme Court of Texas has exclusive and original
- 14 jurisdiction in all cases arising under this section.
- Sec. 28b. (a) In this section, "redistricting year" has the
- 16 meaning assigned by Section 28a of this article.
- 17 (b) The Texas Congressional Redistricting Commission is
- 18 established and consists of the following seven members:
- 19 <u>(1) the governor;</u>
- 20 (2) the lieutenant governor;
- 21 (3) the speaker of the Texas House of Representatives;
- 22 (4) one person appointed by the lieutenant governor;
- 23 (5) one person appointed by the speaker of the Texas
- 24 House of Representatives;
- 25 (6) one person appointed by the largest political
- 26 party represented in the Texas House of Representatives of which
- 27 the speaker of that house is not a member; and

- 1 (7) one person appointed by the largest political
- 2 party represented in the Texas Senate of which the lieutenant
- 3 governor is not a member.
- 4 (c) A member of the commission must be a resident of this
- 5 state. A person is not eligible to serve as a member of the
- 6 commission if the person is a member of the United States Congress.
- 7 (d) A member of the commission appointed under Subsection
- 8 (b)(4), (5), (6), or (7) serves a two-year term that begins on
- 9 February 1 of a redistricting year.
- 10 (e) The two largest political parties represented in the
- 11 legislature shall each designate a member of the commission to
- 12 serve as a co-chair of the commission.
- 13 <u>(f) A member of the commission is not entitled to receive</u>
- 14 compensation for service on the commission but is entitled to
- 15 reimbursement for actual and necessary expenses incurred in
- 16 performing the duties of the commission.
- 17 (g) The commission may employ staff to assist the commission
- 18 in the performance of the duties of the commission.
- 19 (h) The legislature shall appropriate sufficient money for
- 20 the payment of the expenses of members of the commission and any
- 21 staff employed by the commission.
- 22 SECTION 2. This proposed constitutional amendment shall be
- 23 submitted to the voters at an election to be held November 5, 2019.
- 24 The ballot shall be printed to permit voting for or against the
- 25 proposition: "The constitutional amendment providing for the
- 26 reapportionment of congressional districts and the creation,
- 27 function, and duties of the Texas Congressional Redistricting

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1 Commission."
