R E S O L U T I O N

1           WHEREAS, Dr. Michael Miller of Midland is retiring from  
2 Permian Cardiology on December 30, 2018, drawing to a close a  
3 distinguished career in medicine that has spanned nearly four  
4 decades; and

5           WHEREAS, Born and raised in Amarillo, Michael Miller received  
6 his bachelor's degree from Baylor University before earning his  
7 medical degree at The University of Texas Health Science Center at  
8 San Antonio in 1979; he began his career with the U.S. Navy, serving  
9 on the faculty of the Uniformed Services University of the Health  
10 Sciences in Bethesda, Maryland, and as chief of cardiology at the  
11 naval hospital in Oakland, California, where he was also director  
12 of the internal medicine training program; and

13           WHEREAS, In 1989, following his military service, Dr. Miller  
14 joined Permian Cardiology in Midland, where he specialized in  
15 preventive cardiology and the treatment of myocardial infarction;  
16 he played a vital role in establishing the Myocardial Infarction  
17 Task Force at Midland Memorial Hospital, helping the institution  
18 win three Gold Awards from the American Heart Association; in  
19 addition, he has taught as a clinical associate professor at the  
20 Texas Tech University Health Sciences Center School of Medicine and  
21 served as the regional councilor and legislative chair of the Texas  
22 Chapter of the American College of Cardiology; and

23           WHEREAS, Dr. Miller has found time to give back to his  
24 community as a board member of the American Heart Association,

1 United Way, and Casa de Amigos, and he has been involved for many  
2 years with the Boy Scouts; deeply devoted to his faith, he has  
3 traveled to Guyana on a medical mission trip and actively supported  
4 Samaritan's Purse; in all his endeavors, he enjoys the love and  
5 support of his wife, Linda, and he takes pride in their two children  
6 and four grandchildren; and

7 WHEREAS, Dr. Miller's dedication, professionalism, and  
8 expertise have greatly benefited his patients and the community of  
9 Midland, and he may indeed reflect with pride on a career well spent  
10 as he embarks upon the next exciting chapter of his life; now,  
11 therefore, be it

13 Legislature hereby congratulate Dr. Michael Miller on his  
14 retirement from Permian Cardiology and extend to him sincere best
