16 WHEREAS, Residents and visitors alike benefit from the wealth 17 of recreational opportunities in Walker County, where outdoor 18 enthusiasts flock to Sam Houston National Forest and Huntsville 19 State Park as well as to the county's major water resources, Lake 20 Livingston, Lake Conroe, Lake Raven, and the San Jacinto and 21 Trinity Rivers; and
