19 embalmer in Dallas and Fort Worth; in all his endeavors, he enjoys
20 the love and support of his wife, Joy; and

21 WHEREAS, A committed champion of his community, Phil Cory may
22 reflect with pride on all that he has accomplished in its behalf and
23 take satisfaction in knowing that his contributions will continue
24 to benefit area Texans for years to come; now, therefore, be it
