

R E S O L U T I O N

1           WHEREAS, The football team of Bishop Dunne High School in  
2 Dallas reached the pinnacle of success by winning the 2018 Texas  
3 Association of Private and Parochial Schools Division I state  
4 championship on December 7 in Waco; and

5           WHEREAS, After going undefeated in district play during the  
6 regular season, the Falcons opened the playoffs with two dominant  
7 victories, 45-7 over Trinity Christian Academy and 42-0 over  
8 St. Pius X High School, to advance to the semifinals against Parish  
9 Episcopal School; in that contest, quarterback Simeon Evans passed  
10 for two touchdowns and ran for two more while the defense recorded  
11 six sacks and held the Parish Episcopal running game in check en  
12 route to a 31-20 triumph that punched the team's ticket to the  
13 Division I title game; and

14           WHEREAS, With the state crown on the line, Bishop Dunne  
15 matched up against Bishop Lynch High School in a rematch of the 2016  
16 championship showdown; in a closely contested thriller, the Falcons  
17 took a 7-0 lead in the second quarter on a touchdown pass from  
18 Mr. Evans to Andrew Armstrong, but Bishop Lynch rallied to carry a  
19 9-7 lead into the final minute of the game; with just 42 seconds to  
20 play, Mr. Evans connected with Mr. Armstrong on another scoring  
21 strike to recapture the advantage, and the Falcon defense held firm  
22 on the final Bishop Lynch drive to secure the 13-9 victory and the  
23 state championship; and

24           WHEREAS, In addition to the efforts of Mr. Evans and

20 Chris Walton, Chad Morris, and Rodney Hawkins, as well as head  
21 athletic trainer Tye Burch-Bowers and video coordinators Stephen  
22 James, David Johnson, and Ron Johnson; the team also received vital  
23 support from athletic director Kenneth Davis and principal Mary  
24 Beth Marchiony; and

25 WHEREAS, Winning a state championship represents the  
26 culmination of countless hours of hard work and an unwavering  
27 commitment to excellence, and the members of the Bishop Dunne
