

R E S O L U T I O N

1 WHEREAS, The Cuero High School football team reached the
2 pinnacle of success by winning the University Interscholastic
3 League 4A Division 2 state championship on December 21, 2018; and

4 WHEREAS, Under the direction of head coach Travis Reeve, the
5 Cuero Gobblers marched through the postseason with triumphs over
6 Pearsall, Rio Hondo, West Oso, Navarro, and Silsbee High Schools,
7 setting the stage for a showdown with Pleasant Grove High of
8 Texarkana in the title game; and

9 WHEREAS, Taking the field before more than 12,700 fans at
10 AT&T Stadium in Arlington, Cuero trailed by as much as 14 points in
11 the first half but rallied to draw within a point of Pleasant Grove
12 at intermission; both teams were held scoreless in the third
13 quarter, but Cuero launched a devastating ground assault in the
14 final frame, tallying three touchdowns to win by a score of 40-28;
15 with the victory, Cuero clinched its fourth state title in school
16 history, and its first since 1987; and

17 WHEREAS, Senior Jordan Whittington was named both the
18 offensive and the defensive player of the game after scoring 6
19 touchdowns, making 11 tackles, and rolling up 334 rushing yards to
20 set a new state finals record; valuable contributions were also
21 made throughout the season by the other members of the roster as the
22 Gobblers relentlessly pursued their goal of becoming state
23 champions; and

24 WHEREAS, In winning the 4A Division 2 title, the Cuero High

1 football team has become a source of great pride to its school and
2 community, and the players will forever treasure their memories of
3 this notable achievement; now, therefore, be it

4 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 86th Texas
5 Legislature hereby congratulate the Cuero High School football team
6 on winning the 2018 UIL 4A Division 2 state championship and extend
7 to the team's players, coaches, and staff sincere best wishes for
8 continued success; and, be it further

9 RESOLVED, That an official copy of this resolution be
10 prepared for the team as an expression of high regard by the Texas
11 House of Representatives.
