## RESOLUTION

- 1 WHEREAS, Proud citizens of Van Zandt County are gathering at
- 2 the State Capitol on March 5, 2019, to commemorate Van Zandt County
- 3 Day and to celebrate the significant role their home has played in
- 4 the story of the Lone Star State; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Created by an Act of the Texas Legislature on March
- 6 20, 1848, this county in the northeast region of Texas was named for
- 7 Isaac Van Zandt, a lawyer who served as a legislator and diplomat
- 8 for the Republic of Texas; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Canton, the county seat, was laid out in 1850 and
- 10 incorporated in 1919; designated a Main Street City in 2001, it is
- 11 home to the Van Zandt County Fair and Rodeo, as well as one of the
- 12 nation's best-known flea markets, First Monday Trade Days; the city
- 13 is also the location of the Library of Genealogy and Local History,
- 14 which preserves the county's heritage and draws researchers from
- 15 far and near; and
- 16 WHEREAS, The county's other notable communities include Ben
- 17 Wheeler, which was named in 1878 for Benjamin F. Wheeler, an early
- 18 mail carrier in Van Zandt County; and
- 19 WHEREAS, Edgewood, which was first settled in the 1840s,
- 20 hosts the Edgewood Heritage Festival every November at the Heritage
- 21 Park Museum; this popular attraction is dedicated to the
- 22 preservation of rural culture and architecture; and
- 23 WHEREAS, Named after a figure from the Bible, Edom is one of
- 24 the oldest towns in the county, and it is home to 11 state

- 1 historical markers, many of them researched by members of the Edom
- 2 Historical Society; the residents of this small community also give
- 3 hearty support to an active civic theater and popular arts fairs;
- 4 and
- 5 WHEREAS, A 1901 petition by local fruit growers prompted the
- 6 renaming of Bolan Switch to Fruitvale; the town had boasted a fruit
- 7 nursery as early as the 1870s and also had a lumber shipping
- 8 business by the second decade of the 20th century, but Fruitvale was
- 9 not incorporated until the 1960s; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Originally called Jordan's Saline, Grand Saline was
- 11 the first county seat, and it takes its name from an immense dome of
- 12 pure salt that lies beneath the city; more than a mile and a half
- 13 wide and 16,000 feet thick, the deposit is now mined by the Morton
- 14 Salt company; named a Main Street City in 2004, the community
- 15 celebrates its heritage with the Salt Palace, a house built out of
- 16 salt blocks, and an annual Salt Festival; the town is also the
- 17 birthplace of pioneer aviator Wiley Post, whose life is
- 18 commemorated with a historical marker; and
- 19 WHEREAS, Martin's Mill was established in the valley of Cream
- 20 Level Creek before the Civil War; it got its name from Daniel
- 21 G. Martin, who opened a gin and gristmill there in 1875; and
- WHEREAS, The community of Van was established in 1894, and it
- 23 remained a quiet farming community until 1929, when the discovery
- 24 of oil in the area transformed the village into a boomtown; the Van
- 25 Area Oil and Historical Museum and the annual Oil Pageant & Festival
- 26 recapture the excitement of that time; and
- 27 WHEREAS, Wills Point was named for William Wills, who settled

- 1 in the area in the 1840s and whose homestead became a way station
- 2 for travelers; his original cabin still stands in Bruce Park, and
- 3 the old Texas and Pacific Railroad depot features exhibits of local
- 4 history; as the official Bluebird Capital of Texas, Wills Point
- 5 hosts the annual Bluebird Festival every April; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Major events in the county include the Western Swing
- 7 Valentine Party in Canton, the Edom Festival of the Arts, and the
- 8 Relay for Life of Van Zandt County; for the outdoor enthusiast, the
- 9 Neches and Sabine Rivers, Purtis Creek State Park, and Lake
- 10 Tawakoni State Park offer fine opportunities for fishing, boating,
- 11 swimming, camping, and hiking; the county prospers thanks to
- 12 agriculture, oil and gas, and recreational opportunities, and the
- 13 region is a major producer of hay, sweet potatoes, beef cattle, and
- 14 nursery crops; and
- WHEREAS, The people of Van Zandt County take great pride in
- 16 their rich history as they work together to build an even brighter
- 17 future, and it is indeed fitting to honor them and their unique
- 18 contributions to the story of the Lone Star State; now, therefore,
- 19 be it
- 20 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 86th Texas
- 21 Legislature hereby recognize March 5, 2019, as Van Zandt County Day
- 22 at the State Capitol and extend best wishes to the visiting
- 23 residents of the county for an informative and enjoyable stay in
- 24 Austin.
