RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, Many dedicated officers and honorably retired 2 officers of the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department are visiting 3 Austin on February 19, 2019, to celebrate Texas Game Warden Day in 4 conjunction with the annual Texas Game Warden and Game Warden Peace 5 Officer Association Conference at the State Capitol; and

6 WHEREAS, Since 1895, when the office of Fish and Oyster 7 Commissioner was created by the 24th Texas Legislature, game 8 wardens have played an essential role in wildlife conservation; the 9 Fish and Oyster Commission was given jurisdiction in 1899 over all 10 public waters, including freshwater streams, lakes, and ponds, and 11 its purview was soon extended to shrimping and hunting; and

12 WHEREAS, The name of the agency later became the Game, Fish, and Oyster Commission, and it changed again several times to 13 14 reflect the expansion of its mission until, in 1963, it merged with the State Parks Board to form the current agency; in 1919, there 15 16 were just six wardens, but their numbers grew as their duties continued to evolve, encompassing such tasks as the promotion of 17 recreational water safety and the apprehension of criminals 18 involved in a range of illegal activities in addition to wildlife 19 20 law violations; and

21 WHEREAS, In 1971, the legislature formally recognized as 22 peace officers all law enforcement officers within the Texas Parks 23 and Wildlife Department; the state is served today by some 550 game 24 wardens, whose responsibilities have grown to include

3 WHEREAS, For well over a century, game wardens have enforced 4 natural resource conservation laws in the Lone Star State, and 5 their vital contributions have earned the deep appreciation of all 6 Texans; now, therefore, be it
