1 WHEREAS, Cuero High School football star Jordan Whittington
2 closed his senior season in triumphant fashion when he helped the
3 Gobblers football team win its first state championship in over
4 three decades; and

5 WHEREAS, A dominant force on both sides of the ball,
6 Mr. Whittington was named both the Offensive and Defensive Most
7 Valuable Player in the 4A Division 2 state title game after running
8 for a record-breaking 334 yards and accounting for a team-high 11
9 tackles; during the course of the 2018 season, he rushed for 846
10 yards and 14 touchdowns, caught 49 passes for 948 yards and 13
11 touchdowns, and racked up 86 tackles; his accomplishments are all
12 the more impressive given that he missed the first four games of the
13 year due to injury; and

14 WHEREAS, In recognition of his outstanding play,
15 Mr. Whittington was named the 2018 4A Built Ford Tough Texas High
16 School Player of the Year and was selected as a First Team
17 All-American by MaxPreps; he will continue his gridiron career in
18 2019 as a member of the Longhorns football team at The University of
19 Texas at Austin; and

20 WHEREAS, Jordan Whittington has pursued his goals with
21 remarkable drive and an enduring commitment to excellence, and he
22 may take great pride in all that he has achieved as he looks ahead to
23 a college career bright with promise; now, therefore, be it
