## RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, The life of a beloved figure in the Temple and 2 Houston sports communities drew to a close with the passing of Gene 3 Pemberton on January 27, 2019, at the age of 79; and

WHEREAS, The son of E. M. and Aleyne Pemberton, Gene 4 5 Pemberton was born in Cameron on October 27, 1939, and he grew up with the companionship of two siblings, Stanton and Cheryl; he 6 7 graduated from Temple High School and Temple Junior College and earned a business administration degree from Hardin-Simmons 8 9 University in 1962; after joining the American Desk Manufacturing Company, he rose to the positions of vice president of marketing and 10 11 director of special projects during his 31-year tenure with the 12 company; and

13 WHEREAS, A dedicated sports fan, Mr. Pemberton officiated 14 basketball and football games, and in 1984 he was awarded lifetime membership in the Southwest Basketball Officials Association; he 15 entered the sports broadcast booth in 1986, embarking on a storied 16 career as the voice of the Temple High School Wildcats football team 17 that spanned 28 years; providing color commentary for KTEM 18 NewsRadio 14, Mr. Pemberton partnered with Mark McLain on the 19 20 broadcasts, and the pair garnered numerous accolades, including a prestigious Katie Award from the Press Club of Dallas in 1993; 21 Mr. Pemberton gave his final broadcast in 2014, detailing the 22 23 Wildcats' runner-up finish in the 5A Division 1 state championship game; and 24

1 WHEREAS, Mr. Pemberton joined the Houston Astros organization in 1994 and initially held the title of director of 2 3 community development; in 1997, he was named the team's chaplain, becoming the first person in Major League Baseball to hold such a 4 position on a full-time basis; he remained with the club until 2011, 5 and in the course of his service, he helped develop numerous 6 outreach initiatives and formed a close bond with numerous players; 7 8 and

9 WHEREAS, In all his endeavors, Mr. Pemberton enjoyed the love 10 and support of his wife, Mary Holick Pemberton, and they shared a rewarding marriage that spanned 55 years before her passing; he 11 12 took great pride in his three children, Gary, Allen, and Lisa, and 13 he had the pleasure of welcoming into his family five 14 grandchildren, Brandon, Andrew, Jeffrey, Elisabeth, and Emalye; a 15 valued member of his community, Mr. Pemberton was involved with numerous civic activities and served as a deacon at Bethel Church of 16 17 the Assemblies of God; and

18 WHEREAS, Gene Pemberton lived a rich and purposeful life 19 centered on his family, his faith, and his deep love of sports, and 20 he will long be remembered and admired by all those who had the good 21 fortune to know him; now, therefore, be it
