R E S O L U T I O N

1 WHEREAS, The Eagle Aid legal clinic program at Akins High
2 School in Austin has forged a new path in legal education as one of
3 the first high school legal aid clinics in the nation; and

4 WHEREAS, The Eagle Aid clinic is staffed by student interns,
5 who get firsthand experience with the law by providing free legal
6 services to teachers, students, and members of the greater
7 community; to date, the program has offered guidance in immigration
8 law and the drafting of wills, and it will expand to include other
9 branches of the law in 2019; and

10 WHEREAS, The program was established by the school's students
11 in association with faculty member Armin Salek, who is also a
12 practicing attorney; a former intern of State Senator Kirk Watson,
13 Mr. Salek holds a bachelor's degree in government and sociology
14 from The University of Texas at Austin and a law degree from the
15 University of Houston Law Center; and

16 WHEREAS, The program's alumni and current participants
