R E S O L U T I O N

1 WHEREAS, Members of the Live Oak County Historical Commission
2 are visiting the State Capitol on February 26, 2019; and

3 WHEREAS, The Live Oak County Historical Commission was
4 founded in the early 1960s under the auspices of Judge Harry L.
5 Hinton to help preserve and promote local history; today, it
6 strives to educate the public through the publication of historical
7 resources and through collaboration with local civic
8 organizations; staff and volunteers also work with area officials
9 to strengthen policy related to preservation and to honor
10 outstanding individuals and businesses that have helped shape the
11 community; and

12 WHEREAS, In support of its mission to preserve the region's
13 unique history, the commission places historical markers at notable
14 sites throughout the area and advocates for the acquisition of
15 archeological grants to study historic sites, including the Fort
16 Merrill grounds; benefiting from the leadership of cemetery chair
17 Sherry Kosarek, it has made significant progress in cemetery
18 recognition; and

19 WHEREAS, This distinguished organization has been recognized
20 for its efforts with four Distinguished Service Awards from the
21 Texas Historical Commission; and

22 WHEREAS, The Live Oak County Historical Commission works
23 diligently to promote the region's unique cultural history and to
24 preserve the memories of the citizenry, and all those involved with

1 the commission are indeed deserving of special praise; now,
2 therefore, be it

3 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 86th Texas
4 Legislature hereby recognize February 26, 2019, as Live Oak County
5 Historical Commission Day at the State Capitol and extend a warm
