

R E S O L U T I O N

1           WHEREAS, A life made rich through meaningful service drew to  
2 a close with the passing of Estella Lane Trevino of Edinburg on  
3 April 30, 2018, at the age of 95; and

4           WHEREAS, The daughter of Jack Lane Sr. and Estella P. Lane,  
5 the former Estella Lane was born in Red Gate on August 6, 1922, and  
6 grew up there with five siblings, Francisca, Samuel, Jack, Aminta,  
7 and Jovita; when she was only 18, she opened a beauty salon, which  
8 she operated for 21 years; she married the love of her life, Jose  
9 Luis Trevino, and they were blessed with a daughter, Chiqui;  
10 devoted to her family, she joyfully welcomed the addition of a  
11 son-in-law, George X. Guerra, and she became "Bobi" to three  
12 grandchildren, Brian, Leanne, and Steven, and four  
13 great-grandchildren, Xavier, Oslo, Sean, and Cooper; and

14           WHEREAS, Mrs. Trevino was elected in 1959 as the first female  
15 justice of the peace in Hidalgo County; after her four-year tenure,  
16 she worked as a night auditor at the Rodeway Inn in McAllen, and in  
17 1972, she was hired as executive director of the Edinburg Housing  
18 Authority, becoming the first woman to lead a Rio Grande Valley  
19 housing authority; over the course of more than four decades in that  
20 role, she distinguished herself through her skill and great  
21 dedication to ensuring that the most vulnerable members of society  
22 had safe, affordable housing; in 2005, she received the Hall of Fame  
23 Award for Outstanding Service from the Texas Chapter of the  
24 National Association of Housing and Redevelopment Officials; and

1           WHEREAS, Always seeking to make a positive difference,  
2 Mrs. Trevino served on the board of the South Texas Independent  
3 School District, and she represented Rio Grande Valley seniors in  
4 the Texas Silver-Haired Legislature for many years; a valued member  
5 of St. Joseph Catholic Church, she was appointed as a trustee of El  
6 Rosario Charitable Trusts; she was named 2009 Woman of the Year by  
7 the Edinburg Chamber of Commerce, and the City of Edinburg declared  
8 September 23, 2011, as "Estella Lane Trevino Day"; in addition, The  
9 University of Texas-Pan American established an endowment in her  
10 name to provide scholarships for Edinburg students living in public  
11 housing; and

12           WHEREAS, Deeply committed to her family, her faith, and her  
13 community, Estella Lane Trevino earned the lasting respect and  
14 admiration of all who were privileged to know her; now, therefore,  
15 be it

16           RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 86th Texas  
17 Legislature hereby pay tribute to the life of Estella Lane Trevino  
18 and extend sincere condolences to all who mourn her passing; and, be  
19 it further

20           RESOLVED, That an official copy of this resolution be  
21 prepared for her family and that when the Texas House of  
22 Representatives adjourns this day, it do so in memory of Estella  
23 Lane Trevino.
