RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, Residents from Collin County are gathering in Austin

2 on March 26 and 27, 2019, to celebrate Collin County Days at the

3 State Capitol; and

4 WHEREAS, Collin County is one of the largest and

5 fastest-growing counties in the state; more than 90 percent of its

6 workforce over the age of 25 hold a high school diploma and about

7 half have earned at least a bachelor's degree; such highly skilled

8 workers also make the county a leader in job growth; and

9 WHEREAS, With a population of 283,000, Plano is the largest

city in the county and home to a number of iconic global

11 corporations, including Toyota Motor North America, Liberty Mutual

12 Insurance, JPMorgan Chase & Co., Boeing Global Services, NTT DATA,

13 JCPenney, FedEx Office, Frito-Lay, and Capital One; in 2018, the

14 city was recognized as the best place to live in America by

15 AreaVibes, the best city to buy a house in America by Niche, and the

16 best city for jobs in America by Forbes, while maintaining its

17 status as one of the safest cities in America by WalletHub and among

18 the top five best-performing cities in America by the Milken

19 Institute; this thriving municipality boasts nationally recognized

20 schools, award-winning parks, a lively historic downtown district,

21 and multicultural neighborhoods that appeal equally to families,

22 young singles, and retirees; its excellent restaurants, vibrant

23 shopping districts, exciting entertainment venues, and active

24 local arts scene all contribute to the city's high quality of life;

3 Airport, the city of McKinney hosts such major employers as the aerospace division of Raytheon Company, Encore Wire Corporation, 4 5 Emerson Process Management, and Torchmark Corporation; recent relocations include PACCAR and Moss Construction, and the community 6 continues to cultivate its own businesses, including Playful, a 7 8 virtual reality gaming company; in addition, Independent Bank is completing construction of its new headquarters; furthermore, the 9 10 city's historic downtown encompasses more than 130 boutiques; this rapidly growing community currently has a population of nearly 11 188,000, a 230 percent increase from 2011; the McKinney National 12 Airport maintains its status as an economic engine with a \$16 13 million construction project that will update and expand its 14 15 facilities, including a new state-of-the-art FBO terminal and an additional 40,000-square-foot hangar; and 16 17 WHEREAS, Allen is a dynamic and welcoming home to more than 103,000 residents and has been ranked among the safest, most 18 affordable, and most family-friendly cities nationwide, and the 19 city continues to enhance the Texas workforce through the addition 20 and expansion of such international companies as NETSCOUT, Boss 21 Fight Entertainment, and CyrusOne; in 2017, the city was named the 22 number two "Best Place to Live" and number one "Best Place to Live 23 24 in the South" by Money magazine, and the city received the coveted National Recreation and Park Association Gold Medal Award in 2016 25 26 for its creation and stewardship of more than 1,100 acres of parkland, 67 parks and facilities, and 62 miles of hike-and-bike 27

WHEREAS, County seat and home of the McKinney National

- 1 trails; moreover, its volunteer efforts were recognized with the
- 2 2016 Keep Texas Beautiful Governor's Community Achievement Award
- 3 for efforts in environmental education, community beautification,
- 4 and litter prevention; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Defining "Progress in Motion," Frisco is one of the fastest-growing cities in the country and the fastest-growing 6 community over the past decade, according to the United States 7 8 census bureau; it has maintained its quality of life amid rapid development, and the Dallas Morning News named Frisco among its top 9 10 10 suburbs for schools, safety, families with children, young adults, empty nesters, and "Best Overall" neighborhoods; known for 11 top-notch public safety services, the city received the highest 12 rating for fire protection, and it enjoys one of the lowest crime 13 14 rates, as well as low taxes; this once-small town is home to Collin 15 College, Preston Ridge Campus, world-class venues, and seven professional sports organizations, namely the Frisco RoughRiders, 16 17 Dallas Stars, FC Dallas, Texas Legends, Dallas Rattlers, Dallas Cowboys, and the PGA of America; active residents have access to 49 18 19 parks, 86 miles of trails, and an athletic center featuring an outdoor water park; health care facilities include three hospitals, 20 21 and the favorable business climate supports more than nine million square feet of retail and restaurants; among the cultural amenities 22 23 are three museums and hundreds of public and private 24 installations displayed throughout Frisco's approximately 70-square-mile area; and 25
- WHEREAS, The city of Wylie, Wylie Independent School
- 27 District, Wylie Chamber of Commerce, and Wylie Economic Development

1 Corporation work in concert to build a strong community that
2 strives to honor the past, embrace the present, and plan for the
3 future, while valuing unity, relationships, and trust, as evidenced
4 by a recent report naming Wylie the best small city in the country
5 in which to raise a family and the hottest suburb in Texas; Wylie
6 fosters a spirit of cooperation, and with a thriving business

7 environment and outstanding schools, it is a place people treasure

8 and proudly call home; and

9 WHEREAS, The city of Richardson, which is known globally for 10 its high-tech business leadership, is home to the Telecom Corridor area and was named the International Business Capital of North 11 12 Texas by the 82nd Texas Legislature; Richardson is a major employment center, with companies including Blue Cross and Blue 13 14 Shield of Texas, Fossil, RealPage, Fujitsu Network Communications, 15 and Cisco Systems having headquarters in the city; other major employers include State Farm, Raytheon, UnitedHealthcare, Texas 16 17 Instruments, and AT&T; Richardson offers a high quality of life, a diverse array of neighborhoods, and easy access to a multimodal 18 19 transportation infrastructure; the city has repeatedly been recognized as one of the top places to live, work, and obtain an 20 education by national and local media; in 2018, CBS News ranked 21 Richardson the 16th-best city in the United States to live, and it 22 23 finished ninth nationally among top cities for STEM workers by 24 Livability; Richardson is home to The University of Texas at Dallas, the fastest-growing university in the state, and the city 25 26 remains dedicated to continued improvement as well as to the principles of open government and two-way communication with 27

1 residents; and

2 WHEREAS, The city of Murphy, a diverse, historically 3 significant residential community in southeastern Collin County, continues to create a distinctive ambience of homeowner pride and 4 5 neighborhood vitality, and it has maintained its designation as a Top 10 Best Suburb by D Magazine since the inception of the ratings; 6 Murphy's commitment to an enhanced quality of life is reflected in 7 8 the number and level of excellence in its parks system, as well as its highly regarded year-round special events; the emerging 9 10 business community offers a wide range of desirable retail and culinary options, and residents enjoy the safety and security of 11 12 professionally managed public safety functions; and

WHEREAS, Recognized by D Magazine as a top 10 suburb, Prosper 13 14 ranked number one on the Dallas Business Journal's 2018 list of 15 fastest-growing cities and is currently experiencing a 13 percent annual growth rate; located where the northern edge of Dallas' 16 17 Golden Corridor meets the booming U.S. 380 Corridor, the town is poised for explosive commercial, office, and retail growth and 18 19 continued residential development, issuing 915 single-family housing permits and permits for 865,000 square feet of commercial 20 development in 2018, with an additional million square feet of 21 shovel-ready projects due to break ground in 2019; Prosper is home 22 23 to several top housing developers, including Blue Star Land, 24 LandPlan Development, and the Tellus Group; the Prosper Independent School District has been voted by the Dallas Morning News as one of 25 26 the Top 10 Places to Work in Dallas/Fort Worth for five consecutive years, and the district continues to be one of the state and 27

1 national leaders in student growth; recognized as a Tree City USA
2 and certified as a Scenic City silver-level community, Prosper has

3 more than 350 acres of open space and over 22 miles of hike-and-bike

4 trails; moreover, the city's outstanding police department offers

5 such community outreach and crime prevention programs as Citizens

6 on Patrol, the Citizens Police Academy, the Community Safety

7 Initiative, and Smart911; and

8 WHEREAS, Having been a platinum-level Scenic City in Texas since 2011, Fairview has also been recognized as a Tree City USA 9 10 community and earned a Growing Green Cities Award, and it is home to the first street in Texas to be illuminated by LED lighting; the 11 12 town is a three-time recipient of the Texas Municipal League Municipal Excellence Award and on an annual basis continues to earn 13 14 the Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial 15 Reporting from the Government Finance Officers Association; the Development Corporation was 16 Fairview Economic awarded 17 Certificate of Achievement for Economic Excellence by the Texas Economic Development Council in 2017, and the Texas Chapter of the 18 American Planning Association honored Fairview with a Certificate 19 20 of Achievement for Planning Excellence in 2015, 2016, and 2017; in addition, the town's Veterans Park has been recognized with a 21 Patriotic Achievement Award from the Military Order of the World 22 23 Wars; Fairview also features two of the Top 25 Best School Districts in Texas as ranked by Niche and continues to be ranked as one of the 24 safest and most desirable places to live in Texas; and 25

26 WHEREAS, With 78 square miles of land, Celina has the second-27 largest geographic footprint of any city in Collin County;

1 strategic growth plans allow the city to manage new development along the Dallas North Tollway, Preston Road, and future Collin 2 3 County Outer Loop corridors; Celina is one of the fastest-growing communities in the Dallas/Fort Worth Metroplex, having issued 1,249 4 5 single-family housing permits in 2018; the city's robust "Texas historic" downtown is filled with a number of unique shops, 6 offices, and award-winning restaurants, including 7 8 Smokehouse, which was rated the number two best place to eat on Yelp; its school district was recognized for its academic 9 achievements with a prestigious "A" rating, and the city has 10 received numerous accolades for its outstanding budgeting and 11 12 financial reporting; residents and visitors come together to enjoy a number of special events throughout the year, including Movie 13 14 Nights on the Square, Oktoberfest, Splash & Blast, and Cajun Fest; 15 Celina's natural rural beauty, coupled with its exquisite recreational fields and amenities, creates a welcoming, small 16 17 country-feel culture; and WHEREAS, Lucas has maintained a peaceful, rural lifestyle, 18 19 helping to sustain a high quality of life for its citizens; the city is pleased to offer 25 miles of trails along Lake Lavon for 20 equestrian enthusiasts and continues to focus on wildlife habitat 21 preservation, making it the perfect home for the Blackland Prairie 22 Raptor Center; moreover, exceptional schools and a vibrant 23 24 residential market, combined with one of the lowest tax rates in Collin County, make Lucas an excellent value for its residents; and 25 26 WHEREAS, The citizens of Parker are proud to be living in D27 Magazine's number two suburb in the DFW Metroplex, and they also

- 1 enjoy a low municipal tax rate; the residents number more than
- 2 5,000, and they cherish their uniquely "country" lifestyle;
- 3 characterized by its large lots and comfortable atmosphere, Parker
- 4 is known to millions of television viewers as the home of the
- 5 legendary Southfork Ranch from Dallas; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Boasting an area of 64 square miles and the access of
- 7 three major highways, Anna is a family-friendly community with
- 8 hometown appeal; the city, Anna Independent School District, Anna
- 9 Community Development Corporation, and the Greater Anna Chamber of
- 10 Commerce often collaborate to maintain a small community atmosphere
- 11 as the area undergoes rapid urbanization, and it was ranked among
- 12 the safest cities in Texas in 2018 by a SafeWise report; Collin
- 13 McKinney, one of the 5 drafters and 59 signers of the Texas
- 14 Declaration of Independence, lived in Anna for a number of years;
- 15 and
- WHEREAS, Farmersville, located 15 miles east of McKinney,
- 17 took its name from the primary occupation of its original
- 18 residents; established in 1849 as a settlement on the
- 19 Jefferson-McKinney Road and near the Republic of Texas National
- 20 Road, the town was incorporated in 1873; agriculture kept pace as it
- 21 became a trade center, and in the 1930s, Farmersville shipped over
- 22 1,000 carloads of onions annually, earning the nickname "Onion
- 23 Capital of North Texas"; the city may be best known for native son
- 24 Audie Murphy, who listed Farmersville as his hometown when he
- 25 enlisted in the army during WWII and returned home to a hero's
- 26 welcome in 1945; he had earned every army citation for valor, was a
- 27 recipient of the Congressional Medal of Honor, and was posthumously

- 1 awarded the Texas Legislative Medal of Honor; Farmersville has a
- 2 nationally recognized Main Street Program, with many historic
- 3 downtown buildings, eateries, and shopping attractions; near the
- 4 restored Onion Shed is the trailhead for the 130-mile Northeast
- 5 Texas Trail, a beautiful site for walking, hiking, and bicycling;
- 6 and
- WHEREAS, Settled in the mid-1850s, the city of Lavon is
- 8 nestled along the southeastern shore of Lake Lavon, and it is home
- 9 to approximately 3,800 residents who enjoy the friendliness of the
- 10 small-town atmosphere combined with the benefits of living near an
- 11 exciting metro area; the city's growing parks and trail system,
- 12 planned capital improvements, attraction of quality business
- 13 development, growth opportunities, and commitment to service
- 14 contribute to an outstanding quality of life; and
- WHEREAS, The city of Melissa is one of the fastest-growing
- 16 communities in Collin County, gaining roughly one new family per
- 17 day; residents enjoy a friendly atmosphere and close access to a
- 18 number of amenities, as well as more square feet per dollar for the
- 19 price of homes; Melissa is beginning to grow commercially to
- 20 provide its citizens with even more amenities; and
- 21 WHEREAS, Other communities add much to Collin County's
- 22 allure; the growing community of Blue Ridge is committed to
- 23 revitalizing its downtown by providing a small-town rural feel;
- 24 with its beautiful rolling hills, open skies with magnificent
- 25 sunrises and sunsets, and friendly residents, Blue Ridge has a
- 26 quaint charm all of its own; Cattlemans Cafe, established in 1953
- 27 and featured in D Magazine and on Texas Country Reporter, adds to

- 1 the town's neighborly atmosphere with its outstanding chicken fried
- 2 steak; known as the "Home of the Last Texas Prairie in Collin
- 3 County," the drive to Blue Ridge is replete with scenic open spaces
- 4 dotted with cattle and horses; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Located in the center of Collin County, the city of 6 Princeton is a planned community that was named the number one place
- 7 for first-time home buyers in the DFW area by NerdWallet in 2016;
- 8 the city has continued to lead Collin County as one of its
- 9 fastest-growing cities with an average 20 percent growth rate since
- 10 2017, and it issued more than 900 single-family permits in 2018;
- 11 Princeton cultivates a small-town atmosphere by prioritizing the
- 12 addition of new parks, trails, and open space, and it maintains a
- 13 low crime rate by national standards; the city places emphasis on an
- 14 open and transparent government, and it has been recognized with
- 15 the Government Finance Officers Association's Distinguished Budget
- 16 Presentation Award annually since 2015 and its Certificate for
- 17 Excellence in Financial Reporting annually since 2013; the
- 18 Princeton Independent School District earned an "A" rating from the
- 19 state, and it is home to the CATE Center, which provides vocational
- 20 training across numerous skill-based fields; moreover, the
- 21 district participates in the Jump Start Program and offers students
- 22 the opportunity to receive an associate's degree while attending
- 23 high school; and
- 24 WHEREAS, Sachse is a vibrant, diverse, well-educated, and
- 25 growing community that offers its residents a high quality of life
- 26 while retaining its small-town charm; recently named the 11th-
- 27 safest city in Texas, the community prides itself on providing its

- 1 families with a safe place to live; with its prime location along
- 2 the President George Bush Turnpike, Sachse has become a regionally
- 3 significant point of access for the fastest-growing city in eastern
- 4 Collin County; it is the home of an increasingly large retail trade
- 5 area that recently announced a \$250 million mixed-used development
- 6 that includes new residential and more than 400,000 square feet of
- 7 commercial space; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Also contributing to the development of Collin
- 9 County are the residents of Copeville, Lowry Crossing, Nevada, New
- 10 Hope, Royse City, St. Paul, Westminster, and Weston, along with
- 11 parts of Dallas and Garland, and these communities play an
- 12 important part in the county's flourishing, diversified economy and
- 13 its quality of life; and
- WHEREAS, The citizens of this notable North Texas county are
- 15 working to preserve the best of their past even as they look forward
- 16 to a bright and promising future, and they are sure to figure
- 17 prominently in the growth and prosperity of the Lone Star State in
- 18 the years ahead; now, therefore, be it
- 19 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 86th Texas
- 20 Legislature hereby recognize March 26 and 27, 2019, as Collin
- 21 County Days at the State Capitol and extend to the visiting
- 22 delegation sincere best wishes for a meaningful and memorable stay
- 23 in Austin.
