RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, The passing of Dr. Baker Pattillo of Nacogdoches on 2 December 29, 2018, at the age of 75, brought great sorrow to his family and friends, as well as to the campus community of Stephen 3 F. Austin State University, which he served with great distinction 4 5 for more than five decades; and WHEREAS, Born in Camden on June 22, 1943, Baker Pattillo was 6 7 the son of the Reverend Leroy Pattillo and Mauree Pattillo; he moved with his family to Arp in 1956 and lettered as a member of the Tigers 8 football team at Arp High School, where his classmates voted him 9 "most likely to succeed"; he subsequently put himself through 10 11 college, and after studying first at Tyler Junior College, he 12 earned his bachelor's degree in 1965 and his master's degree in guidance and counseling in 1966 from SFA; he later completed a 13 14 Ph.D. in educational administration at Texas A&M University; and WHEREAS, Dr. Pattillo was hired as assistant director of 15 16 placement and financial aid at SFA in 1966; he was promoted to dean of student services in 1972 and to vice president for student 17 affairs in 1979; after being appointed interim president in July 18 2006, he assumed the office of president in January 2007; and 19 20 WHEREAS, Over the course of his 11-year tenure as president, 21 Dr. Pattillo coordinated campus projects that totaled more than \$425 million, including a student recreation center, a nursing 22 23 building, and three residential buildings; moreover, he took well-deserved pride in securing \$150 million in funding for four 24

- 1 additional facilities during his last day of work; under his
- 2 leadership, the university exceeded 13,000 in enrollment,
- 3 surpassing its previous record, and Dr. Pattillo enjoyed a strong
- 4 rapport with students, as well as with faculty, staff, regents, and
- 5 state and national leaders; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Dr. Pattillo shared 52 years of marriage with his
- 7 wife, Janice Pattillo, whom he wed on December 17, 1966, and they
- 8 were blessed with a daughter, Paige, a grandson, Jackson, and a
- 9 son-in-law, Todd; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Through his vision and leadership, Dr. Baker
- 11 Pattillo contributed immeasurably to advancing the mission of
- 12 Stephen F. Austin State University, and he leaves behind a legacy
- 13 that will continue to resonate for years to come; now, therefore, be
- 14 it
- RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 86th Texas
- 16 Legislature hereby pay tribute to the life of Dr. Baker Pattillo
- 17 and extend deepest condolences to his relatives and many friends;
