## RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, The citizens of San Marcos suffered a tragic loss 2 when Officer Kenneth Malcolm Copeland of the San Marcos Police 3 Department lost his life in the line of duty on December 4, 2017, at 4 the age of 58; and

WHEREAS, A native of Houma, Louisiana, Ken Copeland was born 5 on November 26, 1959, to Nile and Theo Copeland; he grew up with the 6 companionship of two brothers, David and Robert, and a sister, 7 Jennifer, and he moved with his family to Houston in 1971; after 8 graduating with a bachelor's degree from Sam Houston State 9 University, he began his law enforcement career in 1982 as a 10 11 corrections officer, working first in Huntsville with the Texas 12 Department of Corrections and then in San Jose, California, from 1988 to 1990; he went on to serve as a deputy sheriff with the Los 13 Angeles County Sheriff's Office from 1990 to 1995; and 14

WHEREAS, In March 1998, Officer Copeland took his oath as a 15 16 member of the San Marcos Police Department, and while fulfilling his duties to the public, he continued his professional development 17 by earning certification as a master peace officer; in addition, he 18 concurrently spent 18 years in the United States Coast Guard, which 19 included service in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom and 20 21 additional work providing port security as a maritime enforcement specialist in Corpus Christi; along the way, he also enjoyed 22 23 working with children in various capacities, and in 2017, he was honored with the San Marcos PD Chief's Recognition Award for his 24

8 WHEREAS, A courageous law enforcement officer, Ken Copeland 9 embodied the highest ideals of his profession, and although he is 10 greatly missed, his friendship, generosity, and selfless devotion 11 to his family and community will remain a lasting source of 12 inspiration; now, therefore, be it

13 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 86th Texas 14 Legislature hereby pay tribute to the memory of Officer Kenneth 15 Malcolm Copeland and extend heartfelt condolences to his relatives, 16 friends, and fellow officers; and, be it further
