R E S O L U T I O N

1 WHEREAS, Edward William Walker retired as general manager of
2 the Wintergarden Groundwater Conservation District on March 31,
3 2019, drawing to a close more than 20 years of service to the people
4 of South Texas; and

5 WHEREAS, Mr. Walker has been general manager of the
6 conservation district since its establishment in January 1999, and
7 for the past two decades, he has been responsible for directing the
8 conservation, preservation, and protection of the groundwater in
9 Dimmit, La Salle, and Zavala Counties; he has built solid
10 relationships with landowners and water well drillers, and under
11 his leadership, the district has become a recognized leader in
12 aquifer recharge, salt water disposal, and the monitoring of water
13 levels in wells; and

14 WHEREAS, A native of Crystal City, Mr. Walker holds a degree
15 from Texas A&M University; earlier in his career, he worked for the
16 Texas Farm Bureau, achieving a million dollars in sales each year
17 and rising to the level of agency manager; moreover, he helped to
18 establish a quail farm and to develop a 400-acre orchard, and he
19 initiated and implemented a 14-year cloud-seeding program that
20 benefited five counties and won the support of Governor Dolph
21 Briscoe; and

22 WHEREAS, Ed Walker's dedication, professionalism, and
23 expertise have greatly benefited his fellow Texans, and he may
24 indeed reflect with pride on his many achievements as he embarks

1 upon the next exciting chapter of his life; now, therefore, be it

2 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 86th Texas
3 Legislature hereby congratulate Edward William Walker on his
4 retirement as general manager of the Wintergarden Groundwater
5 Conservation District and extend to him sincere best wishes for the
