RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, The family, friends, and fellow soldiers of 2 U.S. Army Master Sergeant Jonathan J. Dunbar of Austin suffered an 3 immeasurable loss when he was killed in action in Manbij, Syria, on 4 March 30, 2018, at the age of 36; and

5 WHEREAS, Sergeant Dunbar was deployed to Syria from his 6 assigned post at Headquarters, U.S. Army Special Operations Command 7 at Fort Bragg, North Carolina; supporting a mission as part of 8 Operation Inherent Resolve, he died when an improvised explosive 9 device detonated near his patrol; and

WHEREAS, A combat veteran who spent nearly 13 years in the 10 11 armed forces, Sergeant Dunbar enlisted in the army in May 2005; he 12 first served with the 1st Battalion, 325th Airborne Infantry Regiment, at Fort Bragg, and in the course of that assignment, he 13 14 supported combat operations in Iraq; he transitioned to the 2nd Squadron, 38th Cavalry Regiment, at Fort Hood in 2009, and during 15 his four years as a squad leader, he completed an Afghanistan 16 deployment; after joining the U.S. Army Special Operations Command 17 in 2013, he deployed three more times to Iraq and Afghanistan; and 18

WHEREAS, Sergeant Dunbar received numerous honors in the course of his military service, including three Bronze Star Medals, four Army Commendation Medals, six Army Achievement Medals, the National Defense Service Medal, the Afghanistan and Iraq Campaign Medals, each with two Bronze Service Stars, the Global War on Terrorism Expeditionary Medal, and the Global War on Terrorism
