1           WHEREAS, Memories of a life well lived may help to comfort  
2 those saddened by the death of James T. Washington of San Antonio on  
3 October 25, 2018, at the age of 75; and

4           WHEREAS, The son of Lillie Mae and Prezell Washington, James  
5 Washington was born on March 14, 1943, in Kerens, where he grew up  
6 with 14 siblings, Lillie B., Herbert, Rayfield, L. B., David Lee,  
7 Christine, Ross, J. T., John, Vernon, Ivory, Nathaniel, Annie, and  
8 Lewis; he graduated from Kerens High School and went on to earn a  
9 bachelor's degree from Paul Quinn College and a master's degree from  
10 Baylor University; he later completed mid-management and  
11 superintendent certifications from Texas A&M University-Commerce;  
12 and

13           WHEREAS, Answering his nation's call to duty, Mr. Washington  
14 served in the U.S. Army during the Vietnam War; he received a number  
15 of citations, including the Army Commendation Medal, two Bronze  
16 Stars, and a Purple Heart with oak leaf cluster, and was honorably  
17 discharged at the rank of sergeant; and

18           WHEREAS, Mr. Washington went on to enjoy a rewarding career  
19 in the field of education, and he served as a teacher, coach, and  
20 administrator in the Waco, Wichita Falls, and North East  
21 Independent School Districts; following his retirement, he taught  
22 as an adjunct professor at St. Philip's College in San Antonio; and

23           WHEREAS, A devoted family man, Mr. Washington shared a  
24 rewarding marriage with his wife, Audrey, that spanned 50 years,

1 and he took great pride in his sons, James, Aubrey, and Jason, and  
2 his grandchildren, Trinity, Jaxson, and Jayla; and

3 WHEREAS, Although James Washington is deeply missed, those he  
4 has left behind will forever find inspiration in his generosity,  
5 his strength of character, and his dedication to his loved ones and  
6 to his fellow citizens; now, therefore, be it

7 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 86th Texas  
8 Legislature hereby pay tribute to the memory of James T. Washington  
9 and extend heartfelt sympathy to his relatives and friends; and, be  
10 it further

11 RESOLVED, That an official copy of this resolution be

13 Representatives adjourns this day, it do so in memory of James  
14 T. Washington.
