## RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, Members of the Alzheimer's Association are 2 gathering at the Texas Capitol on April 17, 2019, as part of 3 Alzheimer's Association State Advocacy Day; and

WHEREAS, A progressive neurodegenerative brain disorder, 4 5 Alzheimer's disease robs individuals of their memories and leads to physical impairments; it and 6 progressive mental is the sixth-leading cause of death in the United States, and unlike the 7 other principal causes, there is currently no cure or treatment for 8 9 it and no way to slow its progression; and

WHEREAS, Today, more than 5.8 million Americans are living 10 with Alzheimer's, including 390,000 in Texas; these individuals 11 12 require considerable assistance, and over 1.4 million Texans provide home care to family and friends with Alzheimer's, for a 13 14 total of more than \$20.5 billion in unpaid labor; according to the National Institute on Aging, Alzheimer's disease also indirectly 15 costs businesses more than \$37 billion a year in lost productivity 16 17 as a result of employees missing work or leaving their job to care for a relative; and 18

WHEREAS, With early detection and diagnosis, individuals with Alzheimer's and their families can better plan for the future while gaining access to medications, critical research trials, and support from the Alzheimer's Association; and
