R E S O L U T I O N

1 WHEREAS, Across the nation, April 2020 is being observed as  
2 Distracted Driving Awareness Month; and

3 WHEREAS, Created by the National Safety Council, the campaign  
4 aims to tackle the growing problem of distracted driving, which  
5 encompasses such risky actions as talking on a cell phone, texting,  
6 eating, or grooming while behind the wheel; and

7 WHEREAS, Each year, more than 100,000 automobile crashes in  
8 Texas involve distracted driving; a survey conducted by the Texas  
9 A&M Transportation Institute revealed that 38 percent of Texas  
10 motorists talk on their cell phones at least some of the time while  
11 driving, and more than 21 percent of drivers read or send text  
12 messages or e-mails; and

13 WHEREAS, According to the National Safety Council and the  
14 National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, recent years have  
15 seen the largest percentage increase in traffic fatalities in the  
16 United States in over half a century; while multiple factors  
17 contribute to traffic deaths, the risk of distracted driving due to  
18 technology is growing; and

19 WHEREAS, Increased public awareness of these dangers is key  
20 to reducing incidents of distracted driving, and the monthlong  
21 observance in April is an opportunity for Texans to affirm their  
22 commitment to making our roadways safer for all; now, therefore, be  
23 it
