- 1 WHEREAS, A rich and purposeful life has drawn to a close with
- 2 the death of rodeo rider and producer Joe Davis of Fulshear on March
- 3 25, 2019, at the age of 85; and
- WHEREAS, "Smokey" Davis was born in Crosby on August 25,
- 5 1933, to Joe and Alice Davis; he started breakaway roping at the age
- 6 of 9, winning his first adult event at 11, and he exhibited cattle
- 7 at major livestock shows in Houston, Dallas, and San Antonio while
- 8 he was in high school; he went on to attend the University of
- 9 Houston, where he was president of the rodeo team and competed in
- 10 five events, calf roping, steer roping, steer wrestling, bareback
- 11 riding, and bull riding; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Working as a machinist from 1955 until his
- 13 retirement in 1972, Mr. Davis also operated a ranch and continued
- 14 to compete in the rodeo on the weekends; he and a partner started
- 15 Round-Up Rodeo Productions in 1972, and in 1978, he founded the
- 16 Rafter D Rodeo Company, which staged 50 rodeos a year throughout
- 17 Texas, Oklahoma, and Louisiana, including shows for such
- 18 dignitaries as Egyptian President Anwar Sadat and Queen Beatrix of
- 19 the Netherlands; over the years, he supplied livestock and
- 20 locations for many motion picture and television productions,
- 21 including the television miniseries Lonesome Dove and the series
- 22 The Son; and
- WHEREAS, Mr. Davis served on the board of the International
- 24 Professional Rodeo Association as the stock contractor for the

- 1 Southern Region for 22 years, and he was a lifetime committee member
- 2 of the Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo; he was also a member of the
- 3 Southern Rodeo Association and the Texas Rodeo Association, each of
- 4 which named him producer of the year on many occasions; his other
- 5 honors include induction into the Texas Rodeo Cowboy Hall of Fame
- 6 and the South Central Texas Rodeo Ring of Honor; and
- WHEREAS, Mr. Davis shared 62 years with his wife, Betty,
- 8 until her death in 2016; he was the proud father of 5 children,
- 9 Steve, Donnie, Ronnie, Kathy, and Karen, and later in life he was
- 10 blessed with 10 grandchildren, Jason, Jake, Lesliann, Brettney,
- 11 Hunter, Alicia, Ian, Caley, John, and the late John Edward Nemeth,
- 12 as well as 20 great-grandchildren; and
- WHEREAS, A devoted family man and a true Texas cowboy, Smokey
- 14 Davis lived a life that was rich in professional and personal
- 15 accomplishments, and he will forever be a source of inspiration to
- 16 those he leaves behind; now, therefore, be it
