- 1 WHEREAS, National Safe Boating Week is being observed from
- 2 May 18 to 24, 2019; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Boating, including fishing, sailing, paddling, and
- 4 waterskiing, is an immensely popular recreational activity, and the
- 5 U.S. Coast Guard and its federal, state, and local partners
- 6 encourage all boaters to explore and enjoy America's beautiful
- 7 waters responsibly; and
- 8 WHEREAS, According to the National Safe Boating Council,
- 9 approximately 650 people die in boating-related accidents in the
- 10 United States each year, and 76 percent of those fatalities are
- 11 caused by drowning; the vast majority of accidents occur because of
- 12 human error or poor judgment and can be easily prevented through
- 13 basic safety practices, such as carrying emergency communications
- 14 equipment, participating in free boat safety checks, remaining
- 15 sober while navigating, and wearing life jackets; and
- 16 WHEREAS, Statistics have shown that nearly 85 percent of
- 17 those who drowned in boating mishaps were not wearing a life jacket;
- 18 although many boaters stow life jackets on board, there is rarely
- 19 enough time to properly employ one in the event of an accident; in
- 20 an effort to increase people's willingness to wear this essential
- 21 piece of safety equipment, modern life jackets have been designed
- 22 to be smaller, lighter, and more comfortable; and
- 23 WHEREAS, Boating accidents happen regardless of one's level
- 24 of experience, and wearing a life jacket is the most effective way

- 1 to prevent drowning for veteran and novice boaters alike; now,
- 2 therefore, be it
- 3 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 86th Texas
