RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, Dallas Mavericks star Dirk Nowitzki retired from the 2 National Basketball Association on April 11, 2019, and this 3 occasion offers a welcome opportunity to salute his outstanding 4 accomplishments in the sport; and

5 WHEREAS, The 2018-2019 season was Mr. Nowitzki's 21st with 6 the Mavericks, which set an NBA record for the longest tenure with 7 one team; during his final campaign, he moved into sixth place on 8 the list of all-time leading scorers in NBA history, and when he 9 netted 20 points in his final game, he brought his career total to a 10 remarkable 31,560; his farewell year also saw him take the floor for 11 his 14th All-Star Game; and

WHEREAS, A native of Würzburg, Germany, this exceptional 12 athlete played pro basketball in his home country as a teenager and 13 14 first gained the attention of NBA scouts in 1998; after being selected by the Milwaukee Bucks in the NBA draft that year, he was 15 16 immediately traded to Dallas; his presence helped transform the franchise, and during 2000-2001, the Mavs recorded the first of 17 what would become 11 consecutive seasons in which they won 50 games 18 or more; in 2006, he helped the team make its debut in the NBA 19 20 Finals, and the next year he became the first European player to 21 receive the league's Most Valuable Player honor; and

WHEREAS, In 2011, Mr. Nowitzki earned a place in the pantheon of legendary Texas sports heroes by leading the Mavs to the NBA championship, and he was named the finals MVP for his extraordinary

1 performance; his elite position among Dallas players is also 2 reflected in the record books; he is the team's all-time leader in 3 points, rebounds, blocked shots, minutes played, field goals, and 4 three-pointers; and

5 WHEREAS, Selected to the All-NBA Team 12 years in a row, Mr. Nowitzki's accolades also include the Twyman-Stokes Teammate 6 of the Year Award, which recognized his selfless play 7 and 8 leadership, and the Magic Johnson Award, which honored his cooperation with the media and the public; moreover, he is a 9 10 two-time recipient of the NBA Cares Community Assist Award, and he oversees the Dirk Nowitzki Foundation, which funds charitable 11 initiatives related to children; and 12

13 WHEREAS, Over the course of more than two decades, Dirk 14 Nowitzki distinguished himself as one the NBA's finest players, and 15 the success he achieved as a member of the Dallas Mavericks will be 16 remembered and admired long into the future; now, therefore, be it

17 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 86th Texas 18 Legislature hereby congratulate Dirk Nowitzki on his retirement 19 from the NBA and commend him on his exemplary career in professional 20 basketball; and, be it further

21 RESOLVED, That an official copy of this resolution be 22 prepared for Mr. Nowitzki as an expression of high regard by the 23 Texas House of Representatives.
