

R E S O L U T I O N

1 WHEREAS, A rich and purposeful life drew to a close with the
2 passing of Capy Alexander of Wylie on August 20, 2018, at the age of
3 76; and

4 WHEREAS, The daughter of Cecil and Margaret Stamps, the
5 former Capy Stamps was born in Kiowa, Oklahoma, on September 14,
6 1941, and she grew up in Borger with the companionship of four
7 siblings, Leon, Kenneth, Jean, and June; she attended Texas Tech
8 University, where she was a member of Kappa Kappa Gamma sorority,
9 and she went on to continue her studies at North Texas State
10 University; over the course of her professional career, she held a
11 number of important positions, including assistant director of
12 public relations for Neiman Marcus and administration manager for
13 the Episcopal School of Dallas; in addition, she worked in human
14 resources and new business development for Electronic Data Systems,
15 and she edited 10 books and 2 television scripts written by her
16 husband, Thomas E. Alexander; and

17 WHEREAS, Mrs. Alexander was a caring mother to her two
18 children, Kyle and Michelle, and she had the pleasure of seeing her
19 family grow to include three grandchildren, Kirin, Preston, and
20 Daniel; a longtime Episcopalian, she served as a choir leader and
21 parish library president at St. Peter's Episcopal Church in
22 Kerrville, and she joined the St. Peter's congregation in McKinney
23 when she moved to the area in 2017; and

24 WHEREAS, Active in civic affairs, Mrs. Alexander served as

1 president of the Gillespie County Republican Women and the
2 Republican Women of Kerr County, as a board member, convention
3 delegate, and committee chairperson for the Texas Federation of
4 Republican Women, and as a delegate for the National Federation of
5 Republican Women; in recognition of her contributions, she received
6 the TFRW "10 Outstanding" Award in 2009; moreover, she was a member
7 of the Daughters of the American Revolution and of the
8 Philanthropic Educational Organization; and

9 WHEREAS, Deeply devoted to her family, her faith, and her
10 community, Capy Alexander made a meaningful difference in many
11 lives, and she will long be remembered with great affection by all
12 who knew her; now, therefore, be it

13 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 86th Texas
14 Legislature hereby pay tribute to the memory of Capy Alexander and
15 extend sincere sympathy to those who mourn her passing; and, be it
16 further

17 RESOLVED, That an official copy of this resolution be

19 Representatives adjourns this day, it do so in memory of Capy
20 Alexander.
