## RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, Twenty-three Texas A&M University students are 2 providing valuable support to the 86th Texas Legislature while gaining experience in public service as members of the Agricultural 3 and Natural Resources Policy Internship Program and the Public 4 5 Policy Internship Program; and WHEREAS, For nearly three decades, the Agricultural and 6 7 Natural Resources Policy Internship Program has sent student interns to Austin and Washington, D.C., where they work on a wide 8 9 array of issues; their strong background and interest agriculture and natural resources allow them to offer specialized 10 11 knowledge to legislators; the program was founded in response to a 12 request by a member of the United States Congress for an intern who could assist his office with these matters, and it has since grown 13 14 to include numerous congressional offices as well as the United States House of Representatives Committee on Agriculture, the 15 United States Department of Agriculture, and offices on the state 16 level during legislative years; approximately 1,000 students have 17 participated in semester-long internships; and 18 WHEREAS, The Public Policy Internship Program, established 19 20 in 1999, works with various colleges and departments to create an 21 interdisciplinary environment for comprehensive academic training, 22 research, and policy programming; interns in the nation's capital 23 and in Austin serve in a variety of settings that align with their 24 academic and professional goals; some 900 students have
