12 WHEREAS, In 1951, Mr. Jackson married Imogene Wheeler, and the couple shared a rewarding marriage that spanned 68 years; he was 13 14 the proud father of four children, John, Pat, Janet, and Charles, and later in life, he was "Pepaw" to his eight grandchildren, John, 15 16 Jonathan, Christina, Kristen, Stephanie, Joel, Patrick, and Kate, 17 and his four great-grandchildren, George, Grace, Landon, and

WHEREAS, After living in San Angelo and Ozona, Mr. Jackson 19 and his family settled in Big Lake, where he and his wife operated 20 21 Farm and Ranch Supply and maintained ranching operations in Reagan and Schleicher Counties for many years; Mr. Jackson served as 22 23 president of the Big Lake Chamber of Commerce & Industry and the

Reagan County School Board, and he was an honorary director of the 24

- 4 he enjoyed meeting new people, and he delighted in telling stories,

- 7 Lake for more than half a century, serving as a deacon, treasurer,
- 8 Sunday school teacher, and song leader; and

- 11 long be remembered with deep affection by all who were privileged to
