3 Eziquiel D. Cavazos on October 10, 2017, at the age of 64; and

4 WHEREAS, The son of Urbano and Delores Cavazos, Zeke Cavazos
5 was born in Raymondville on December 5, 1952, and grew up with five
6 siblings, Anita, Doris, Margaret, Louisa, and Urbano; he graduated
7 from Texas A&I University and went on to earn a master's degree in
8 education; and

9 WHEREAS, First named a Raymondville city commissioner in
10 2001, Mr. Cavazos was reelected to a fifth consecutive term in May
11 2017; he further enjoyed a fulfilling career as an educator, and he
12 served as principal of Myra Green Middle School in the Raymondville
13 Independent School District; a talented musician who played guitar,
14 piano, and saxophone, he taught music at L. C. Smith Elementary,
15 and he also taught art for Lasara ISD; moreover, he tirelessly
16 worked in behalf of his fellow citizens as a volunteer firefighter;

18 WHEREAS, Mr. Cavazos was blessed with the love and support of
19 his wife, Josie, and he took great pride in his two children, Rob
20 and Lisa, and his four grandchildren, Avrie, Addison, Parker, and
21 Colton; and

22 WHEREAS, A devoted family man and a dedicated public servant,
23 Zeke Cavazos is deeply missed, but the compassion, joy, and
24 generosity with which he lived his life will forever inspire all who

1 had the good fortune to know him; now, therefore, be it
