

R E S O L U T I O N

1 WHEREAS, The Katy Independent School District was named the
2 Advanced Placement Large District of the Year by The College Board
3 on April 25, 2019; and

4 WHEREAS, One of 373 districts from across the United States
5 considered for the award, Katy ISD was selected as the AP Large
6 District of the Year in recognition of its efforts to expand its AP
7 program; over the last three years, Katy ISD has increased student
8 participation in the AP exams by 18 percent annually, resulting in
9 approximately 1,500 more students being involved in the program
10 this year than in 2016; furthermore, the district has improved exam
11 performance, with over 77 percent of its 12,000 AP tests receiving a
12 score of a three or higher; and

13 WHEREAS, Under the able leadership of superintendent Ken
14 Gregorski and school board president Courtney Doyle, Katy ISD
15 serves more than 80,000 students at 69 campuses; the district has
16 received an A rating from the Texas Education Agency and an A+ from
17 Niche.com, and it was recently named to The College Board's AP Honor
18 Roll for the seventh time; and

19 WHEREAS, A quality education is critical to the continued
20 vitality of our state, and the faculty, staff, and administrators
21 of Katy ISD are indeed deserving of recognition for their efforts to
22 foster a supportive and challenging academic environment; now,
23 therefore, be it
