3 22, 2019, at the age of 65; and

4 WHEREAS, Jeff Weiss was born in Detroit, Michigan, on
5 November 7, 1953, to Betty Eddings and Carl Helwig, and he was
6 raised by Joseph E. Weiss; after earning his bachelor's degree in
7 economics from Michigan State University, he entered the financial
8 industry, working first at E. F. Hutton and later concluding his
9 career at Raymond James Financial; and

11 began pursuing his passion for aviation in 1977; he went on to log
12 more than 5,600 flight hours and held certification as an Airline
13 Transport Pilot, the highest level of aircraft pilot certification;
14 always willing to offer his time, aircraft, and experience to those
15 in need, he volunteered with a number of notable organizations,
16 including Angel Flight South Central, Experimental Aviation
17 Association Young Eagles, and Pilots N Paws, among others; in
18 addition, he was a member of the Aircraft Owners & Pilots
19 Association and the AOPA Foundation, as well as the National
20 Business Aviation Association, the Commemorative Air Force, and the
21 1940 Air Terminal Museum advisory board of directors; and

22 WHEREAS, Jeff Weiss lived a caring and purposeful life, and
23 he will long be remembered with deep affection by all who held him
24 close in their hearts; now, therefore, be it
