1           WHEREAS, A life made rich through meaningful service drew to  
2 a close with the passing of Pamela Lynn Munn of Lampasas on January  
3 9, 2019, at the age of 62; and

4           WHEREAS, Born in Newport News, Virginia, on September 17,  
5 1956, Pam Munn grew up with the companionship of four siblings, Ron,  
6 Rick, Page, and Dusty; she moved with her family to Houston, and she  
7 graduated from Stephen F. Austin High School in 1975, later earning  
8 a degree in criminal justice from Sam Houston State University; and

9           WHEREAS, This distinguished Texan began her career in law  
10 enforcement as the first female officer to serve in the Huntsville  
11 Police Department, and she quickly moved up the ranks from patrol  
12 officer to detective and sergeant; she relocated to Austin in  
13 September 1985 to work as an investigator for the Medicaid Fraud  
14 Control Unit of the Texas Attorney General's Office, where her  
15 accomplishments included promotion to supervising investigator; in  
16 1997, she transferred to the Texas State Auditor's Office and  
17 worked with a Special Investigations Unit that dealt with financial  
18 crimes against the state; she was promoted to unit manager and  
19 served until her retirement in 2015; and

20           WHEREAS, Ms. Munn exchanged the vows of matrimony with her  
21 husband, Chris, in 1986, and they went on to share a rewarding  
22 family life with their three children, Jefferson, Cassandra, and  
23 Amber; in addition to spending time with her loved ones, she was  
24 active in the Lampasas community, volunteering with the local

1 elections office and library fund-raisers and contributing to a  
2 number of programs and committees at the First United Methodist  
3 Church; she also enjoyed fishing, gardening, and participating in a  
4 local women's bowling league with her team, the Alley Cats; and

5 WHEREAS, Pam Munn earned the admiration of all who knew her,  
6 not only for her dedication to public service but also for her  
7 exceptional kindness and generosity, and she leaves behind a legacy  
8 that will resonate in the Lampasas community for years to come; now,  
9 therefore, be it

10 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 86th Texas  
11 Legislature hereby pay tribute to the memory of Pamela Lynn Munn and  
12 extend heartfelt sympathy to her family and many friends; and, be it

16 Representatives adjourns this day, it do so in memory of Pamela Lynn
