1 WHEREAS, Residents of Lubbock lost an admired civic leader
2 with the death of Dr. Paul Gene Meyer on March 4, 2005; and

3 WHEREAS, A neurosurgeon and veteran of the United States
4 Army, Paul Meyer served his country in the Medical Corps during the
5 Vietnam War, and he received the Army Commendation Medal; he joined
6 the surgery department at University Medical Center in 1978 when it
7 first opened as Lubbock General Hospital; and

8 WHEREAS, Dr. Meyer was a passionate champion of education,
9 and he took enormous pleasure in helping to design and teach the
10 basic neuroscience course for medical students at the Texas Tech
11 University Health Sciences Center; in 1995, Governor George W. Bush
12 appointed him to the Texas State Board of Medical Examiners;
13 Dr. Meyer also contributed to his community as president of the
14 board of the Lubbock Symphony Orchestra and as a longtime Rotarian;

16 WHEREAS, Devoted to his family, Dr. Meyer shared a fulfilling
17 relationship with his wife, Marie, and he was the proud father of
18 six children, Erin, Lisa, Gregory, Morgan, Kerry, and Nick; with
19 the passing years, he experienced the joy of becoming "Grampy" to
20 seven grandchildren, Hannah, Noah, Emma, Eli, Isabel, Harrison, and
21 Molly; in his leisure time, he enjoyed socializing with friends and
22 loved ones and playing the banjo; and

23 WHEREAS, Dr. Paul Meyer is deeply missed by those he left
24 behind, but his dedication to his family, his community, and the
