## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

Τ	AN ACT
2	relating to emergency and disaster management, response, and
3	recovery.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 418.005, Government Code, is amended by

- 7 (c-1) The training course provided under this section 8 related to the emergency management responsibilities of officers of 9 political subdivisions must include training based on the disaster 10 response guide as required by Section 418.054(b).
- SECTION 2. Subchapter C, Chapter 418, Government Code, is amended by adding Sections 418.054, 418.055, 418.056, and 418.057 to read as follows:
- Sec. 418.054. DISASTER RESPONSE GUIDE. (a) The division

  shall develop a model guide for local officials regarding disaster

  response and recovery. The guide must provide a comprehensive

  approach to disaster recovery by local officials and include

  information on:
- (1) contracting for debris removal;

adding Subsection (c-1) to read as follows:

- 20 (2) obtaining federal disaster funding;
- 21 (3) coordinating the availability and construction of
- 22 short-term and long-term housing; and
- 23 (4) obtaining assistance from local, state, and
- 24 federal volunteer organizations.

1 (b) The division, in coordination with the Texas A&M 2 AgriLife Extension Service and the Texas A&M Engineering Extension Service, shall provide training based on the disaster response 3 guide as a part of the emergency management training course 4 provided under Section 418.005. 5 Sec. 418.055. CATASTROPHIC DEBRIS MANAGEMENT PLAN AND 6 7 TRAINING. (a) The division, in consultation with the Emergency Management Council, the Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service, the 8 9 Texas A&M Engineering Extension Service, the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality, the Texas Department of Transportation, the 10 comptroller, and political subdivisions, shall develop a 11 catastrophic debris management plan and model guide for use by 12 13 political subdivisions in the event of a disaster. (b) The plan must: 14 (1) provide a guide for clearance and disposal of 15 16 debris caused by a disaster; and 17 (2) include: 18 (A) provisions for the use of trench burners and air curtain incinerators of vegetative debris, including 19 20 identifying sources of equipment for use immediately following a 21 disaster; and 22 (B) contracting standards and a model contract 23 for use in procuring debris removal services following a disaster. (c) The division shall consult with the comptroller about 24 25 including a contract for debris removal services on the schedule of

multiple award contracts developed under Subchapter I, Chapter

2155, or in another cooperative purchasing program administered by

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- 1 the comptroller.
- 2 (d) The Texas A&M Engineering Extension Service, in
- 3 coordination with the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality,
- 4 shall establish a training program for state agencies and political
- 5 subdivisions on the use of trench burners in debris removal.
- 6 Sec. 418.056. WET DEBRIS STUDY GROUP. (a) In this
- 7 section, "study group" means the wet debris study group established
- 8 under this section.
- 9 (b) The wet debris study group is established and consists
- 10 of the following members:
- 11 (1) each member of the Emergency Management Council;
- 12 (2) representatives from river authorities appointed
- 13 by the governor;
- 14 (3) environmental experts appointed by the governor;
- 15 and
- 16 (4) a representative from the Texas Historical
- 17 Commission appointed by the governor.
- 18 (c) The study group shall study issues related to preventing
- 19 the creation of wet debris and best practices for clearing wet
- 20 debris following a disaster, including:
- 21 (1) the creation of maintenance programs for bodies of
- 22 water in this state;
- 23 (2) issues related to the clearance of wet debris on
- 24 private property following a disaster; and
- 25 (3) potential sources of funding for the clearance of
- 26 wet debris following a disaster.
- 27 (d) Not later than November 1, 2020, the study group shall

- 1 submit a report containing recommendations on the issues described
- 2 by Subsection (c) to each member of the legislature.
- 3 (e) The study group is abolished and this section expires
- 4 January 1, 2021.
- 5 Sec. 418.057. EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT WORK GROUP. (a) In
- 6 this section:
- 7 (1) "Emergency management director" and "emergency
- 8 management coordinator" mean the director and coordinator,
- 9 <u>respectively</u>, designated under Section 418.1015.
- 10 (2) "Work group" means the work group established
- 11 under this section.
- 12 (b) The division shall establish a work group of persons
- 13 knowledgeable on emergency management to study and develop a
- 14 proposal for enhancing the training and credentialing of emergency
- 15 management directors and emergency management coordinators.
- (c) As part of the study and proposal under Subsection (b),
- 17 the work group shall:
- 18 (1) assess the training and credentials necessary for
- 19 emergency management directors and emergency management
- 20 coordinators to effectively oversee the response to and recovery
- 21 from a disaster; and
- 22 (2) consult with institutions of higher education as
- 23 <u>defined by Section 61.003</u>, Education Code, on the development of
- 24 degree programs in emergency management in addition to the programs
- 25 that exist in this state on September 1, 2019.
- 26 (d) In conducting the assessment required by Subsection
- (c)(1), the work group shall consider:

- 1 (1) whether the differences in geography, population,
- 2 and <u>critical</u> infrastructure between emergency management
- 3 directors' or emergency management coordinators' jurisdictions
- 4 warrant different levels of training and credentialing;
- 5 (2) whether the legislature should enact laws
- 6 requiring an emergency management director or emergency management
- 7 coordinator to participate in emergency management training and
- 8 <u>credentialing before overseeing the response to and recovery from a</u>
- 9 disaster;
- 10 (3) whether to implement incentives for emergency
- 11 management directors, emergency management coordinators, and any
- 12 other emergency management personnel to complete additional
- 13 training and continuing education; and
- 14 (4) proposals for paying the cost for training for
- 15 emergency management directors and emergency management
- 16 coordinators that is more rigorous than the training required by
- 17 law for the directors and coordinators on September 1, 2019.
- 18 (e) Not later than November 1, 2020, the work group shall
- 19 submit the proposal required under this section to the governor,
- 20 lieutenant governor, speaker of the house of representatives, and
- 21 members of the legislature.
- 22 (f) The work group is abolished and this section expires
- 23 <u>January 1, 2021.</u>
- 24 SECTION 3. (a) In this section:
- 25 (1) "Commission" means the Health and Human Services
- 26 Commission.
- 27 (2) "Division" means the Texas Division of Emergency

- 1 Management.
- 2 (b) The commission and the division shall conduct a study to
- 3 determine the feasibility of developing:
- 4 (1) a single intake form that would compile all
- 5 information needed to obtain disaster assistance from multiple
- 6 state and federal programs for an individual who needs assistance
- 7 as a result of a disaster; and
- 8 (2) an automated intake system for collecting the
- 9 information.
- 10 (c) The commission and the division shall coordinate with
- 11 the Federal Emergency Management Agency and other appropriate state
- 12 and federal agencies to conduct the study under Subsection (b) of
- 13 this section. The commission and the division must determine
- 14 whether the Federal Emergency Management Agency and other
- 15 appropriate state and federal agencies will accept the single
- 16 intake form.
- 17 (d) Not later than September 1, 2020, the commission and the
- 18 division shall prepare and submit a written report to the
- 19 legislature containing the findings of the study conducted under
- 20 Subsection (b) of this section and any recommendations to the
- 21 legislature.
- (e) This section expires January 1, 2021.
- SECTION 4. Not later than January 1, 2020, the Texas
- 24 Division of Emergency Management shall develop the catastrophic
- 25 debris management plan and model guide required by Section 418.055,
- 26 Government Code, as added by this Act.
- 27 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
