## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to measures to facilitate the transfer, academic progress,
3	and timely graduation of students in public higher education.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter H, Chapter 51, Education Code, is
6	amended by adding Sections 51.400 and 51.4033 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 51.400. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:
8	(1) "Coordinating board" means the Texas Higher
9	Education Coordinating Board.
10	(2) "General academic teaching institution" and
11	"institution of higher education" have the meanings assigned by
12	<u>Section 61.003.</u>
13	Sec. 51.4033. REPORT OF NONTRANSFERABLE CREDIT. (a) Not
14	later than September 1 of each year and in the form prescribed by
15	the coordinating board, each general academic teaching institution
16	shall provide to the coordinating board a report describing any
17	courses in the Lower-Division Academic Course Guide Manual or its
18	successor adopted by the coordinating board for which a student who
19	transfers to the institution from another institution of higher
20	education is not granted academic credit at the receiving
21	institution.
22	(b) A report required by this section must indicate:
23	(1) the course name and type;
24	(2) which institution of higher education provided

- 1 academic credit for the course; and
- 2 (3) the reason why the receiving institution did not
- 3 grant academic credit for the course.
- 4 SECTION 2. Section 51.762, Education Code, is amended by
- 5 adding Subsection (j) to read as follows:
- 6 (j) In adopting a form under this section, the board shall
- 7 ensure that an applicant may indicate on the form the applicant's
- 8 consent to an institution of higher education to which the
- 9 applicant submits an application for admission to a particular
- 10 degree program using the form to, if the institution denies the
- 11 applicant admission to that degree program, provide the applicant's
- 12 application to other institutions of higher education that offer
- 13 the degree program.
- SECTION 3. Section 51.9685(a)(2), Education Code, is
- 15 amended to read as follows:
- 16 (2) "Institution of higher education" <u>has</u> [and "public"
- 17 <del>junior college" have</del>] the <u>meaning</u> [meanings] assigned by Section
- 18 61.003.
- 19 SECTION 4. Section 51.9685, Education Code, is amended by
- 20 amending Subsections (b), (c), and (g) and adding Subsection (c-2)
- 21 to read as follows:
- (b) Except as otherwise provided by Subsection (c), each
- 23 student enrolled in an associate or bachelor's degree program at an
- 24 institution of higher education shall file a degree plan with the
- 25 institution before [not later than] the end of the [second regular]
- 26 semester or term immediately following the semester or term in
- 27 which the student earned a cumulative total of 30 [45] or more

- 1 semester credit hours for coursework successfully completed by the
- 2 student, including transfer courses, international baccalaureate
- 3 courses, dual credit courses, and any other course for which the
- 4 institution the student attends has awarded the student college
- 5 course credit, including course credit awarded by examination.
- 6 (c) A student to whom Subsection (b) [this section] applies
- 7 who begins the student's first semester or term at an institution of
- 8 higher education with 30 [45] or more semester credit hours of
- 9 course credit for courses described by Subsection (b) shall file a
- 10 degree plan with the institution  $\underline{before}$  [ $\underline{not later than}$ ] the end of
- 11 that [the student's second regular] semester or term [at the
- 12 <u>institution</u>].
- 13 (c-2) A student enrolled in a dual credit course at an
- 14 institution of higher education and to whom Subsection (b) does not
- 15 apply shall file a degree plan with the institution not later than:
- 16 (1) the end of the second regular semester or term
- 17 <u>immediately following the semester or term in which the student</u>
- 18 earned a cumulative total of 15 or more semester credit hours of
- 19 course credit for dual credit courses successfully completed by the
- 20 student; or
- 21 (2) if the student begins the student's first semester
- 22 or term at the institution with 15 or more semester credit hours of
- 23 <u>course credit for dual credit courses successfully completed by the</u>
- 24 student, the end of the student's second regular semester or term at
- 25 the institution.
- 26 (g) The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board, in
- 27 consultation with institutions of higher education, shall [may]

- 1 adopt rules as necessary for the administration of this section,
- 2 including rules to ensure compliance with this section. In
- 3 adopting those rules, the coordinating board shall use the
- 4 negotiated rulemaking procedures under Chapter 2008, Government
- 5 Code.
- 6 SECTION 5. Subchapter Z, Chapter 51, Education Code, is
- 7 amended by adding Sections 51.96852 and 51.96853 to read as
- 8 follows:
- 9 <u>Sec. 51.96852.</u> RECOMMENDED COURSE SEQUENCES. (a) In this
- 10 section:
- 11 (1) "Coordinating board" means the Texas Higher
- 12 Education Coordinating Board.
- 13 (2) "Institution of higher education" has the meaning
- 14 assigned by Section 61.003.
- 15 (b) Each institution of higher education shall develop at
- 16 least one recommended course sequence for each undergraduate
- 17 certificate or degree program offered by the institution. Each
- 18 recommended course sequence must:
- 19 (1) identify all required lower-division courses for
- 20 the applicable certificate or degree program;
- 21 (2) include for each course, if applicable:
- (A) the course number or course equivalent under
- 23 the common course numbering system approved by the coordinating
- 24 board under Section 61.832; and
- 25 (B) the course equivalent in the Lower-Division
- 26 Academic Course Guide Manual or its successor adopted by the
- 27 coordinating board;

1 (3) be designed to enable a full-time student to obtain a certificate or degree, as applicable, within: 2 3 (A) for a 60-hour degree or certificate program, 4 two years; or 5 (B) for a 120-hour degree program, four years; 6 and 7 (4) include a specific sequence in which courses should be completed to ensure completion of the applicable program 8 9 within the time frame described by Subdivision (3). 10 (c) Each institution of higher education shall: 11 (1) include the recommended course sequences developed under this section in the institution's course catalog 12 13 and on the institution's Internet website; and (2) submit the recommended course sequences developed 14 15 under this section to the coordinating board as provided by coordinating board rule. 16 17 Sec. 51.96853. TRANSFER OF CREDIT FROM LOWER-DIVISION INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER EDUCATION; ARTICULATION 18 AGREEMENTS. In this section: 19 (1) "Articulation agreement" means a formal written 20 agreement between a lower-division institution of higher education 21 and a general academic teaching institution identifying courses 22 23 offered by the lower-division institution that must be accepted for 24 credit toward specific course requirements at the general academic 25 teaching institution.

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(2) "General academic teaching institution" has the

- 1 (3) "Lower-division institution of higher education"
- 2 means a public junior college, public state college, or public
- 3 technical institute, as those terms are defined by Section 61.003.
- 4 (b) Each genera<u>l academic teaching institution may enter</u>
- 5 into an articulation agreement with a lower-division institution of
- 6 higher education for a certificate or degree program for which
- 7 students transferring from the lower-division institution to the
- 8 general academic teaching institution receive transfer credit.
- 9 (c) An articulation agreement entered into under Subsection
- 10 (b) on or after September 1, 2019, must, to the greatest extent
- 11 practicable, use fields of study curricula developed by the Texas
- 12 Higher Education Coordinating Board under Section 61.823.
- 13 (d) A general academic teaching institution may extend an
- 14 existing articulation agreement entered into under Subsection (b)
- 15 to another lower-division institution of higher education with
- 16 respect to the transfer of courses from that lower-division
- 17 institution of higher education to the general academic teaching
- 18 institution, on request by that lower-division institution of
- 19 higher education.
- 20 (e) An articulation agreement established under this
- 21 section may enable a transfer student to receive up to 60 semester
- 22 credit hours for courses completed at the lower-division
- 23 institution of higher education.
- 24 <u>(f) A general academic teaching institution's participation</u>
- 25 in an articulation agreement under this section does not affect the
- 26 institution's admissions policies.
- 27 SECTION 6. Section 51.9715, Education Code, is amended by

- 1 adding Subsection (a-1) and amending Subsection (b) to read as
- 2 follows:
- 3 (a-1) An institution of higher education, or a school
- 4 district that offers international baccalaureate courses, dual
- 5 credit courses, or any other course for which an institution of
- 6 higher education may award students enrolled at the district
- 7 college course credit, including course credit awarded by
- 8 examination, may release student information to an institution of
- 9 higher education for purposes of transferring course credit to that
- 10 institution or enabling the awarding of course credit by that
- 11 institution, in accordance with federal law regarding the
- 12 confidentiality of student information, including the Family
- 13 Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 (20 U.S.C. Section
- 14 1232g), and any state law relating to the privacy of student
- 15 information.
- 16 (b) An institution of higher education or school district
- 17 may release student information in accordance with Subsection (a)
- 18 or (a-1), as applicable, through:
- 19 (1) the National Student Clearinghouse; or
- 20 (2) a similar [national] electronic data sharing and
- 21 exchange platform operated by an agent of the institution or
- 22 <u>district</u> that meets nationally accepted standards, conventions,
- 23 and practices.
- SECTION 7. Section 61.059(p), Education Code, is amended to
- 25 read as follows:
- 26 (p) In its instruction and operations formula applicable to
- 27 an institution of higher education, the board may not include any

- 1 semester credit hours earned for dual course credit by a high school
- 2 student for high school and college credit at the institution
- 3 unless those credit hours are earned through any of the following:
- 4 (1) a course in the core curriculum of the institution
- 5 providing course credit;
- 6 (2) a course offered by the institution providing
- 7 course credit in:
- 8 (A) a field of study curriculum developed by the
- 9 board under Section 61.823; or
- 10 (B) a program of study curriculum established by
- 11 the board under Section 61.8235;
- 12 (3) a career and technical education course that
- 13 applies to any certificate or associate's degree offered by the
- 14 institution providing course credit; or
- (4)  $\left[\frac{(3)}{(3)}\right]$  a foreign language course.
- SECTION 8. Section 61.822, Education Code, is amended by
- 17 adding Subsections (a-2), (a-3), (f), and (g) and amending
- 18 Subsections (b), (c), and (d) to read as follows:
- 19 <u>(a-2) The recommended core curriculum developed under</u>
- 20 Subsection (a-1) must have the following components:
- 21 (1) a general core curriculum of at least 30 semester
- 22 credit hours that includes:
- 23 (A) six semester credit hours in each of the
- 24 <u>following component areas:</u>
- (i) American or Texas history, as provided
- 26 by Section 51.302;
- 27 (ii) government or political science, as

1	provided by Section 51.301; and
2	(iii) communication; and
3	(B) three semester credit hours in each of the
4	<pre>following component areas:</pre>
5	(i) language, philosophy, or culture; and
6	(ii) creative arts; and
7	(2) for each broad academic discipline, an academic
8	discipline core curriculum of not more than 12 semester credit
9	hours specific to that discipline and that includes relevant
10	courses in mathematics and physical sciences.
11	(a-3) In developing an academic discipline core curriculum
12	as described by Subsection (a-2), the board, in accordance with
13	rules adopted by the board using the negotiated rulemaking
14	procedures under Chapter 2008, Government Code, shall consult with
15	relevant faculty at institutions of higher education.
16	(b) Each institution of higher education shall adopt a core
17	curriculum of [ <del>no less than</del> ] 42 semester credit hours, including
18	specific courses comprising the curriculum. The core curriculum
19	shall <u>:</u>
20	(1) include a general core curriculum and, for each
21	broad academic discipline offered by the institution, an academic
22	discipline core curriculum as described by Subsection (a-2); and
23	(2) be consistent with the common course numbering
24	system approved by the board and with the statement,
25	recommendations, and rules issued by the board. [An institution
26	may have a core curriculum of other than 42 semester credit hours
27	only if approved by the board.

- 1 (c) If a student successfully completes the 42-hour core 2 curriculum or the general core curriculum or academic discipline core curriculum at an institution of higher education, that block 3 4 of courses may be transferred to any other institution of higher education and must be substituted for the receiving institution's 5 core curriculum, general core curriculum, or academic discipline 6 7 core curriculum, as applicable. A student shall receive academic credit toward the applicable disciplinary course requirements for 8 9 the student's degree program for each of the courses transferred and may not be required to take additional core curriculum, general 10 core curriculum, or academic discipline core curriculum courses, as 11 applicable, at the receiving institution [unless the board has 12 approved a larger core curriculum at the institution]. 13
- A student who transfers from one institution of higher 14 15 education to another without completing the core curriculum of the 16 sending institution shall receive academic credit from the receiving institution toward that institution's general core 17 curriculum or academic discipline core curriculum, as applicable, 18 for each of the courses that the student has successfully completed 19 in the core curriculum of the sending institution. 20 receipt of credit for these courses, the student may be required to 21 satisfy any remaining [further] course requirements in the core 22 curriculum of the receiving institution. 23
  - (f) Each institution of higher education shall:

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25 (1) identify in the institution's course catalog and 26 on the institution's Internet website each course offered by the 27 institution that fulfills a course requirement in the institution's

- 1 general core curriculum or academic discipline core curriculum and
- 2 the specific course requirement that the course fulfills;
- 3 (2) provide to the board in accordance with board rule
- 4 the institution's general core curriculum and academic discipline
- 5 core curriculum and the information described by Subdivision (1);
- 6 and
- 7 (3) advise each student enrolled at the institution
- 8 regarding the importance of taking coherent sequences of courses in
- 9 the core curriculum that are aligned with the student's academic
- 10 and career goals.
- 11 (g) To assist in advising a student regarding the selection
- 12 of coherent sequences of courses in the core curriculum that are
- 13 aligned with the student's academic and career goals, the board
- 14 shall make available to each institution of higher education and to
- 15 school counselors and other postsecondary advisors employed by a
- 16 school district or charter school information regarding:
- 17 (1) the general core curriculum and academic
- 18 discipline core curriculum required under Subsection (b); and
- 19 (2) the transferability of course credit between
- 20 institutions of higher education for courses in the core curriculum
- 21 as provided by this section.
- SECTION 9. Section 61.823, Education Code, is amended by
- 23 adding Subsection (f) to read as follows:
- 24 <u>(f) A public junior college or public technical institute</u>
- 25 shall adopt in whole or in part each field of study curriculum
- 26 developed by the board under this section for an academic area in
- 27 which the college or institute offers courses.

- 1 SECTION 10. Section 61.827, Education Code, is amended to
- 2 read as follows:
- 3 Sec. 61.827. RULES. (a) The board is authorized to adopt
- 4 rules implementing the provisions of this subchapter.
- 5 (b) In adopting rules regarding the recommended core
- 6 curriculum developed under Section 61.822, the board shall use the
- 7 <u>negotiated rulemaking procedures under Chapter 2008, Government</u>
- 8 Code.
- 9 SECTION 11. Section 130.0104(c), Education Code, is amended
- 10 to read as follows:
- 11 (c) In complying with the requirements regarding the filing
- 12 of a <u>degree plan under</u> [Notwithstanding] Section 51.9685, [before
- 13 the beginning of the regular semester or term immediately following
- 14 the semester or term in which] a student enrolled [successfully
- 15 completes a cumulative total of 30 or more semester credit hours for
- 16 coursework] in a multidisciplinary studies associate degree
- 17 program established under this section[, the student] must meet
- 18 with an academic advisor to complete a degree plan[, as defined by
- 19 Section  $51.9685(a)(1)_{r}$ ] that:
- 20 (1) accounts for all remaining credit hours required
- 21 for the completion of the degree program; and
- 22 (2) emphasizes:
- 23 (A) the student's transition to a particular
- 24 four-year college or university that the student chooses; and
- 25 (B) preparations for the student's intended
- 26 field of study or major at the four-year college or university.
- SECTION 12. Section 51.9685(c-1), Education Code, is

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- 1 repealed.
- 2 SECTION 13. Each public institution of higher education
- 3 required to submit a report under Section 51.4033, Education Code,
- 4 as added by this Act, shall submit the first report not later than
- 5 September 1, 2021.
- 6 SECTION 14. Sections 51.762, 51.9715, and 61.822, Education
- 7 Code, as amended by this Act, and Sections 51.96852 and 51.96853,
- 8 Education Code, as added by this Act, apply beginning with the
- 9 2021-2022 academic year.
- 10 SECTION 15. Not later than December 31, 2020, the Texas
- 11 Higher Education Coordinating Board shall develop a recommended
- 12 core curriculum that conforms to the requirements of Section
- 13 61.822, Education Code, as amended by this Act.
- 14 SECTION 16. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
