A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

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1	AN ACT
2	relating to the establishment and duties of the human trafficking
3	prevention coordinating council.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 402, Government Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 402.034 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 402.034. HUMAN TRAFFICKING PREVENTION COORDINATING
8	COUNCIL. (a) In this section, "council" means the human
9	trafficking prevention coordinating council.
10	(b) The office of the attorney general shall establish the
11	human trafficking prevention coordinating council to develop and
12	implement a five-year strategic plan for preventing human
13	trafficking in this state.
14	(c) The council is composed of the following:
15	(1) the governor or the governor's designee;
16	(2) the attorney general or the attorney general's
17	designee;
18	(3) the commissioner of the Department of Family and
19	Protective Services or the commissioner's designee;
20	(4) the public safety director of the Department of

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state agencies, appointed by the chief administrative officer of

(5) one representative from each of the following

Public Safety or the director's designee; and

1	(A) the Texas Workforce Commission;
2	(B) the Texas Alcoholic Beverage Commission;
3	(C) the Parks and Wildlife Department; and
4	(D) the Texas Department of Licensing and
5	Regulation.
6	(d) The presiding officer of the council is the attorney
7	general or the attorney general's designee.
8	(e) For each five-year period, the council shall:
9	(1) develop and implement a strategic plan for
10	preventing human trafficking in this state; and
11	(2) submit the strategic plan to the legislature.
12	(f) The strategic plan must include:
13	(1) an inventory of human trafficking prevention
14	programs and services in this state that are administered by state
15	agencies, including institutions of higher education, and
16	<pre>political subdivisions;</pre>
17	(2) regarding the programs and services described by
18	Subdivision (1):
19	(A) a report on the number of persons served by
20	the programs and services; and
21	(B) a plan to coordinate the programs and
22	services to achieve the following goals:
23	(i) eliminate redundancy;
24	(ii) ensure the agencies' use of best
25	practices in preventing human trafficking; and
26	(iii) identify and collect data regarding
27	the efficacy of the programs and services; and

- 1 (3) in relation to the goals for programs and services
- 2 as described by Subdivision (2)(B), a plan to coordinate the
- 3 expenditure of state funds allocated to prevent human trafficking
- 4 in this state, including the expenditure of state funds by the task
- 5 force established under Section 402.035 or by a successor entity
- 6 established by the office of the attorney general.
- 7 (g) Not later than December 1 of each year, beginning with
- 8 the year following the year the council submits a strategic plan to
- 9 the legislature under Subsection (e)(2), the council shall submit
- 10 to the legislature an annual report detailing the progress of the
- 11 strategic plan's implementation. The annual report must include:
- 12 (1) a description of the level of participation in the
- 13 strategic plan by each agency represented on the council and how the
- 14 implementation of the strategic plan serves to coordinate the
- 15 programs and services described by Subsection (f)(1) and achieve
- the goals described by Subsection (f)(2)(B); and
- 17 (2) an update of the inventory of programs and
- 18 services described by Subsection (f)(1) and how each program or
- 19 service furthers the goals of the strategic plan.
- 20 (h) The office of the attorney general shall make available
- 21 on the office's Internet website the strategic plan and the annual
- 22 reports required under Subsection (g).
- SECTION 2. Not later than May 1, 2020, the human trafficking
- 24 prevention coordinating council shall submit to the legislature the
- 25 five-year strategic plan required by Section 402.034(e),
- 26 Government Code, as added by this Act.
- 27 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
