1 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies only 2 to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act. 3 An offense committed before the effective date of this Act is 4 governed by the law in effect on the date the offense was committed, 5 and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose. For 6 purposes of this section, an offense was committed before the 7 effective date of this Act if any element of the offense was 8 committed before that date.
