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(b) A state agency shall provide to an individual entitled to a veteran's employment preference for employment or appointment over other applicants for the same position who do not have a greater qualification a veteran's employment preference, in the following order of priority:

8 (3) <u>a spouse of a veteran with a disability as</u>
9 <u>described by Section 657.002(4);</u>

a veteran with a disability;

10 <u>(4)</u> a veteran's surviving spouse who has not 11 remarried; and

12 (5) [(4)] an orphan of a veteran if the veteran was 13 killed while on active duty.

SECTION 3. Section 657.005(b), Government Code, is amended to read as follows:

(b) An applicant who is <u>either</u> a veteran with a disability or a spouse of a veteran with a disability as described by Section <u>657.002(4)</u> shall furnish the official records to the individual whose duty is to fill the position.

SECTION 4. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to 20 an open position with a state agency for which the state agency 21 begins accepting applications on or after the effective date of 22 this Act. An open position with a state agency for which the state 23 24 agency begins accepting applications before the effective date of 25 this Act is governed by the law in effect on the date the state agency began accepting applications, and the former 26 law is 27 continued in effect for that purpose.

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1 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
