- 7 management services for the school and for holding the management
- 8 company accountable for the school's performance.
- 9 SECTION 2. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to
- 10 a charter granted or renewed on or after the effective date of this
- 11 Act.
- 12 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
