1	AN ACT
2	relating to disciplinary proceedings applicable to a licensed
3	forensic analyst.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 4-c, Article 38.01, Code of Criminal
6	Procedure, is amended by amending Subsection (c) and adding
7	Subsections (d) and (e) to read as follows:
8	(c) The commission shall give written notice by certified
9	mail of a determination described by Subsection (a) to a license
10	holder who is the subject of the determination. The notice must:
11	(1) include a brief summary of the alleged misconduct
12	or violation;
13	(2) state the disciplinary action taken by the
14	commission; and
15	(3) inform the license holder of the license holder's
16	right to a hearing before the Judicial Branch Certification
17	Commission on the occurrence of the misconduct or violation, the
18	imposition of disciplinary action, or both.
19	(d) Not later than the 20th day after the date the license
20	holder receives the notice under Subsection (c), the license holder
21	may request a hearing by submitting a written request to the
22	Judicial Branch Certification Commission. If the license holder
23	fails to timely submit a request, the commission's disciplinary
24	action becomes final and is not subject to review by the Judicial

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1 Branch Certification Commission.

(e) If the license holder requests a hearing, the Judicial 2 Branch Certification Commission shall conduct a hearing to 3 determine whether there is substantial evidence to support the 4 determination under Subsection (a) that the license holder 5 committed professional misconduct or violated this article or a 6 7 commission rule or order under this article. If the Judicial Branch Certification Commission upholds the determination, the Judicial 8 Branch Certification Commission shall determine the type of 9 disciplinary action to be taken. The Judicial Branch Certification 10 Commission shall conduct the hearing in accordance with the 11 procedures provided by Subchapter B, Chapter 153, Government Code, 12 13 as applicable, and the rules of the Judicial Branch Certification Commission. [Disciplinary proceedings of the commission are 14 15 governed by Chapter 2001, Government Code. A hearing under this 16 section shall be conducted by an administrative law judge of the 17 State Office of Administrative Hearings.

18 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies only 19 to a disciplinary action taken on or after the effective date of 20 this Act. A disciplinary action taken before the effective date of 21 this Act is governed by the law in effect on the date the action was 22 taken, and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.

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SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.

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
