9	pregnant women for a period of not less than 12 months following the
10	date the woman delivers or experiences an involuntary miscarriage.
11	(1-2) Notwithstanding Subsection $(1-1)$, the commission
12	shall continue to provide medical assistance to a woman who is
13	eligible for medical assistance for pregnant women:
14	(1) during the state fiscal year beginning September
15	1, 2019, for a period of not less than four months following the
16	date the woman delivers or experiences an involuntary miscarriage;
17	and
18	(2) during the state fiscal year beginning September
19	1, 2020, for a period of not less than eight months following the
20	date the woman delivers or experiences an involuntary miscarriage.
