- 5 SECTION 1. Articles 18.191(c) and (d), Code of Criminal
- 6 Procedure, are amended to read as follows:
- 7 (c) Not later than the 30th day after the date a firearm
- 8 subject to disposition under this article is seized, the law
- 9 enforcement agency holding the firearm shall contact the court in
- 10 the county having jurisdiction to order commitment under Chapter
- 11 574, Health and Safety Code, and request the disposition of the
- 12 case. Not later than the 30th day after the date of this request,
- 13 the clerk of the court shall advise the requesting agency whether
- 14 the person taken into custody was released under Section 573.023 or
- 15 574.028, Health and Safety Code, or was ordered to receive
- 16 inpatient mental health services under Section 574.034 or 574.035,
- 17 Health and Safety Code.
- 18 (d) Not later than the 30th day after the date the clerk of
- 19 the court informs a law enforcement agency holding a firearm
- 20 subject to disposition under this article that the person taken
- 21 into custody was released under Section 573.023 or 574.028, Health
- 22 and Safety Code, the law enforcement agency shall:
- 23 (1) conduct a check of state and national criminal
- 24 history record information to verify whether the person may

- 1 lawfully possess a firearm under 18 U.S.C. Section 922(g); and
- 2 (2) provide written notice to the person by certified
- $3\,\,$  mail that the firearm may be returned to the person on verification
- 4 under Subdivision (1) that the person may lawfully possess the
- 5 firearm.
- 6 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
