A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to civil and criminal liability for the unlawful 3 disclosure of intimate visual material. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 5 SECTION 1. Section 98B.002(a), Civil Practice and Remedies Code, is amended to read as follows: 6 7 (a) A defendant is liable, as provided by this chapter, to a person depicted in intimate visual material for damages arising 8 from the disclosure of the material if: 9 (1) the defendant discloses the intimate visual 10 material without the effective consent of the depicted person and 11 12 with the intent to harm that person; 13 (2) at the time of the disclosure, the defendant knows 14 or has reason to believe that the intimate visual material was obtained by the defendant or created under circumstances in which 15 16 the depicted person had a reasonable expectation that the material would remain private; 17 (3) the disclosure of the intimate visual material 18 causes harm to the depicted person; and 19 20 (4) the disclosure of the intimate visual material 21 reveals the identity of the depicted person in any manner, including through: 22 23 (A) any accompanying or subsequent information 24 or material related to the intimate visual material; or

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1 (B) information or material provided by a third party in response to the disclosure of the intimate visual 2 3 material. 4 SECTION 2. Section 21.16(b), Penal Code, is amended to read 5 as follows: (b) A person commits an offense if: 6 (1) without the effective consent of the depicted 7 8 person and with the intent to harm that person, the person [intentionally] discloses visual material depicting another person 9 10 with the person's intimate parts exposed or engaged in sexual conduct; 11 12 (2) at the time of the disclosure, the person knows or has reason to believe that the visual material was obtained by the 13 14 person or created under circumstances in which the depicted person 15 had a reasonable expectation that the visual material would remain 16 private; the disclosure of the visual material causes harm 17 (3) to the depicted person; and 18 the disclosure of the visual material reveals the 19 (4) identity of the depicted person in any manner, including through: 20 21 (A) any accompanying or subsequent information 22 or material related to the visual material; or 23 (B) information or material provided by a third 24 party in response to the disclosure of the visual material. 25 SECTION 3. (a) Section 98B.002, Civil Practice and 26 Remedies Code, as amended by this Act, applies only to a cause of action that accrues on or after the effective date of this Act. A 27

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cause of action that accrues before the effective date of this Act
is governed by the law applicable to the cause of action immediately
before the effective date of this Act, and that law is continued in
effect for that purpose.

(b) Section 21.16, Penal Code, as amended by this Act, 5 6 applies only to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act. An offense committed before the effective date of this 7 Act is governed by the law in effect on the date the offense was 8 committed, and the former law is continued in effect for that 9 purpose. For purposes of this subsection, an offense was committed 10 before the effective date of this Act if any element of the offense 11 was committed before that date. 12

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SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.

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
