- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 6.03(a), Tax Code, is amended to read as
- 7 (a) The appraisal district is governed by a board of
- 8 directors. Five directors are appointed by the taxing units that
- 9 participate in the district as provided by this section. If the
- 10 county assessor-collector is not appointed to the board, the county
- 11 assessor-collector serves as a nonvoting director. The county
- 12 assessor-collector is ineligible to serve if the board enters into
- 13 a contract under Section 6.05(b) or if the commissioners court of
- 14 the county enters into a contract under Section 6.24(b). To be
- 15 eligible to serve on the board of directors, an individual other
- 16 than a county assessor-collector serving as a nonvoting director
- 17 must<u>:</u>
- 18  $\underline{\text{(1)}}$  be a resident of the district;
- 19 <u>(2)</u> [and must] have resided in the district for at
- 20 least two years immediately preceding the date the individual takes
- 21 office; and
- 22 (3) be an elected member of the governing body of a
- 23 taxing unit entitled to vote on the appointment of the district's
- 24 board members under this section. [An individual who is otherwise

- 1 eligible to serve on the board is not ineligible because of
- 2 membership on the governing body of a taxing unit. An employee of a
- 3 taxing unit that participates in the district is not eligible to
- 4 serve on the board unless the individual is also a member of the
- 5 governing body or an elected official of a taxing unit that
- 6 participates in the district.
- 7 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act does not
- B affect the right of a person serving on the board of directors of an
- 9 appraisal district on the effective date of this Act to complete the
- 10 person's term on the board.
- 11 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
