Section 391.038, Transportation Code, is amended to read as follows: 6 Sec. 391.038. SIGN HEIGHT. 7 (a) Except as otherwise provided by this section, a sign may not be higher than 60 feet, 8 9 excluding a cutout that extends above the rectangular border of the sign, measured: 10 11 (1) from the grade level of the centerline of the 12 main-traveled way, not including a frontage road of a controlled access highway, closest to the sign at a point perpendicular to the 13 14 sign location; or 15 (2) if the main-traveled way is below grade, from the 16 base of the sign structure [This section applies only to a sign existing on March 1, 2017, that was erected before that date]. 17 18 (a-1) Subsection (a) does not apply to a sign regulated by a municipality certified for local control under an agreement with 19 the department as provided by department rule. 20 21 (b) A sign existing on March 1, 2017, that was erected before that date [described by Subsection (a)] may not be higher 22 23 than 85 feet, excluding a cutout that extends above the rectangular border of the sign, measured: 24

1 (1) from the grade level of the centerline of the 2 main-traveled way, not including a frontage road of a controlled 3 access highway, closest to the sign at a point perpendicular to the 4 sign location; or

5 (2) if the main-traveled way is below grade, from the 6 base of the sign structure.

7 (c) A person may rebuild a sign <u>existing on March 1, 2017,</u> 8 <u>that was erected before that date</u> [described by Subsection (a)] 9 without obtaining a new or amended permit from the department, 10 provided that the sign is rebuilt at the same location where the 11 sign existed on March 1, 2017, and at a height that does not exceed 12 the height of the sign on that date.

13 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
