- 4 SECTION 1. Section 122.001, Civil Practice and Remedies
- 5 Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 6 Sec. 122.001. PROTECTION OF JURORS' EMPLOYMENT; JUROR'S
- 7 RIGHT TO REEMPLOYMENT; NOTICE OF INTENT TO RETURN. (a) An $[\frac{A}{A}]$
- 8 private] employer may not discharge, threaten to discharge,
- 9 <u>intimidate</u>, or coerce any [terminate the employment of a] permanent
- 10 employee because the employee serves as a juror, or for the
- 11 employee's attendance or scheduled attendance in connection with
- 12 the service, in any court in the United States.
- 13 (b) An employee who is discharged, threatened with
- 14 discharge, intimidated, or coerced [whose employment is
- 15 terminated] in violation of this section is entitled to return to
- 16 the same employment that the employee held when summoned for jury
- 17 service if the employee, as soon as practical after release from
- 18 jury service, gives the employer actual notice that the employee
- 19 intends to return.
- 20 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
