1 AN ACT relating to the reporting of health care-associated infections and 2 3 preventable adverse events at health care facilities. Δ BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. Section 98.103, Health and Safety Code, 5 is 6 amended by amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (a-1) to read as follows: 7 (a) A health care facility[, other than a pediatric and 8 adolescent hospital, shall report to the department each health 9 care-associated infection [the incidence of surgical site 10 infections], including the causative pathogen if the infection is 11 12 laboratory-confirmed, that occurs [occurring] in the facility and 13 that the federal Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services 14 requires a facility participating in the Medicare program to report 15 through the federal Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's National Healthcare Safety Network, or its successor [following 16 17 procedures: 18 [(1) colon surgeries; 19 [(2) hip arthroplasties; [(3) knee arthroplasties; 20 [(4) abdominal hysterectomies; 21 22 [(5) vaginal hysterectomies; [(6) coronary artery bypass grafts; and 23 24 [(7) vascular procedures].

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1	(a-1) A health care facility shall report each health
2	care-associated infection to the department under this section
3	regardless of the facility's participation in Medicare.
4	SECTION 2. The following provisions of the Health and
5	Safety Code are repealed:
6	(1) Section 98.001(10);
7	(2) Sections 98.103(b) and (c); and

8 (3) Section 98.105.

9 SECTION 3. (a) The executive commissioner of the Health 10 and Human Services Commission shall adopt rules as necessary to 11 implement Section 98.103, Health and Safety Code, as amended by 12 this Act, not later than January 1, 2020.

(b) Section 98.103, Health and Safety Code, as amended by this Act, applies only to a report for a health care-associated infection occurring on or after January 1, 2020. A report for a health care-associated infection occurring before that date is governed by the law as it existed on the date the infection occurred, and that law is continued in effect for that purpose.

The Health and Human Services Commission is SECTION 4. 19 required to implement a provision of this Act only if the 20 legislature appropriates money specifically for that purpose. 21 If 22 the legislature does not appropriate money specifically for that purpose, the commission may, but is not required to, implement a 23 24 provision of this Act using other appropriations available for that 25 purpose.

26 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
