- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 16.0921(a), Election Code, is amended to
- 6 read as follows:
- 7 (a) Except as provided by Subsection (c), for a voter whose
- 8 registration is challenged [on the filing of a sworn statement
- 9 under Section 16.092] alleging a ground based on residence, the
- 10 registrar shall promptly deliver to the voter whose registration is
- 11 challenged a confirmation notice in accordance with Section 15.051
- 12 if the voter fails to appear or submit an affidavit to offer
- 13 evidence or argument at a hearing under Section 16.093.
- SECTION 2. Section 16.093(a), Election Code, is amended to
- 15 read as follows:
- 16 (a) On the filing of a sworn statement under Section 16.092
- 17 [alleging a ground other than residence], the registrar shall
- 18 schedule a hearing on the challenge. [The hearing procedure does
- 19 not apply to an allegation of a ground based on residence.
- SECTION 3. Section 16.095, Election Code, is amended by
- 21 amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (e) to read as
- 22 follows:
- 23 (a) Except as provided by Subsection (e), after [After]
- 24 hearing and considering the evidence or argument, the registrar

- 1 shall promptly determine the challenge and issue a decision in
- 2 writing.
- 3 (e) For a challenge alleging a ground based on residence,
- 4 the registrar may not make a determination and shall send a
- 5 confirmation notice in accordance with Section 16.0921 if the voter
- 6 does not appear at the hearing on the challenge or offer evidence or
- 7 argument by affidavit.
- 8 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 9 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 10 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 11 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 12 Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
