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1 a safe and healthy school environment; and (H) 2 (I) school employee wellness; (3) appropriate grade levels and of 3 methods 4 instruction for human sexuality instruction; 5 (4) strategies for integrating the curriculum components specified by Subdivision (2) with the following elements 6 in a coordinated school health program for the district: 7 (A) school health services; 8 9 (B) counseling and guidance services; 10 (C) a safe and healthy school environment; and school employee wellness; [and] 11 (D) if feasible, joint use agreements or strategies 12 (5) for collaboration between the school district and community 13 organizations or agencies; and 14 15 (6) appropriate grade levels and curriculum for 16 instruction regarding opioid addiction and abuse and methods of administering an opioid antagonist, as defined by Section 483.101, 17 18 Health and Safety Code. SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 19 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 20 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 21 22 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this

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Act takes effect September 1, 2019.

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
